（新山12日讯）埔来区国会议员拿督沙拉胡丁昨日探访新山甘拔士希纳然花园的火灾灾黎，并移交援助金和救济品给他们，助他们渡过难关。

沙拉胡丁也是农业及农基工业部长，他于昨午3时30分左右，在助理张秀慧和翁加化陪同下抵达甘拔士希纳然花园，实地了解情况。

张秀慧受访时说，有5户家庭受火患影响，不过沙拉胡丁昨天实地了解情况时只遇见一户灾黎，因此他把援助金和救济品直接移交给对方。

她表示，另外4户的救济品通过村长移交，援助金则须他们亲自到埔来区国会议员服务中心领取；救济品包括乾粮等。

上述火灾于本月10日早上10时许发生，有3间单层排屋90%被烧毁，2间单层排屋40%被烧。

Nelayan mahu sungai dilebar segera

Laluan sempit sukar kan darat hasil tangkapan

Pantai Remis: Lebih 100 komuniti nelayan, termasuk pengusaha bot di Kampung Panchor, di sini memohon supaya kerja pelebaran sungai di perkampungan itu disegerakan bagi membantu per-

kembangan aktiviti perikanan di kawasan terabit.

Pengusaha bot nelayan, Faizul Sofian, 42, berkata pelebaran itu membabitkan 80 meter di sepanjang 1.5 kilometer sungai berkenaan bagi memudahkan pergerakan bot bersaiz besar, khusus bagi mendaratkan hasil tangkapan mereka.

Katanya, ketika ini hanya bot nelayan kelas A boleh memasuki kawasan itu dan mereka berharap dengan melebarkan sungai berkenaan, ia akan membolehkan bot nelayan kelas B dan C menggunakan untuk pendaratan hasil tangkapan.

"Ini akan membabitkan kawasan paya bakau tetapi keluasan

diperlukan tidak begitu banyak kerana laluan (sungai) sedia ada agak sempit, malah tempat meletak bot juga terhad.

"Di muara Sungai Bagan Panchor juga sudah penuh dengan bot nelayan lain kerana di sini terdapat lebih 1,000 bot termasuk bot nelayan tradisional," katanya ketika ditemui, di sini.

Katanya, sumber pendapatan mereka 85 peratus bergantung kepada hasil laut, malah beliau turut mendakwa isu berkenaan sudah dimaklumkan kepada Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Asas Tani, Datuk Salahuddin Ayub, Mei tahun lalu, namun masih belum menerima jawapan.

Pengusaha bot, Tneh Zi Seng, 25,

berkata Bagan Panchor adalah lokasi pengeluaran ikan kedua terbesar di negara ini, dengan lokasi berkenaan semakin sejak hingga menyukarkan bot baharu untuk masuk.

"Justeru, kami berharap kerajaan dapat melebarkan sungai kerana ada segelintir nelayan yang terpaksa berpindah keluar untuk menangkap ikan kerana sudah tiada tempat untuk meletak atau menyimpan bot di sini," katanya.

Sementara itu, Ketua Kampung Panchor, Osman Kadir, 58, berkata, perkara itu sudah dibawa kepada Ahli Parlimen Beruas, Datuk Ngeh Koo Ham untuk tindakan lanjut.

Fish breeders have nothing left to salvage

RM2mil in losses recorded after mass fish die-off

GEORGE TOWN: The mass death of fish in Teluk Bahang has resulted in six fish breeders losing over RM2mil.

Among the two million dead fish found afloat over the past few days were barramundi, groupers, hybrid groupers and snappers.

One of the breeders, Lim Soon Gian, 55, said the last time they encountered a die-off was in June.

"We thought losing thousands of fish then was bad but it was worse this time as all the fish were wiped out. There was nothing left for me to salvage," said Lim, who related his plight to reporters yesterday.

The amount of losses included that of breeder Ooi Hye Hin, who said he lost RM800,000 on Sunday after more than 50,000 of his fish died.

Centre for Marine and Coastal

Studies (Cemacs) director Prof Datuk Dr Aileen Tan said the combination of a number of stressors could have led to the mass die-off.

"Among the reasons could be the existence of high levels of hydrogen sulphide, low dissolved oxygen, and the recent Typhoon Lekima."

"As Teluk Bahang is a very shallow bay, the strong winds and currents during the storm may have stirred up toxic materials from the seabed," she said yesterday.

Prof Tan said they also found extremely high phytoplankton bloom in the area, which depletes dissolved oxygen from the water.

"As of now, we need to look at more parameters but the levels of dissolved oxygen was definitely not favourable for fish culture," she said.

Prof Tan said the dead fish should be buried to prevent attracting flies, which could in turn spread diseases.

Penang environment committee chairman Phee Boon Poh said a task force was on the case.

"We have been investigating metal poisoning in Teluk Bahang since April. The course of the investigation will take about 18 months, as we will need to have complete reports and build a database before we can conclude the investigation."

"The data includes iron levels, metal content, discharges into the water from the surrounding area, phosphate levels, levels of dissolved oxygen in the area, and more."

"Other factors we have to look at include whether the breeders are overbreeding or if there are too many fish in one enclosure," he said.

On May 28, *The Star* reported thousands of farmed groupers died in the same area, with test results revealing the cause of death as being extremely low levels of dissolved oxygen.

Tapping into tourism

Kedah aims to provide basic infrastructure for islands

THE Kedah government plans to build small jetties in Pulau Songsong, Pulau Telur and Pulau Bidan in Yan district next year, to facilitate easy access to domestic and foreign tourists to the tourist destinations.

State youth and sports, tourism, arts and culture, and entrepreneurship development committee chairman Mohd Asmirul Anuar Aris said that besides the construction of the jetties, other infrastructure including public toilets would also be built.

"The state government has discussed with the Implementation Coordination Unit of the Prime Minister's office to ensure the success of tourism programmes in Kedah.

"And, to make that happen, we need funding from the Federal government to help in the development and implementation of tourism products."

"With the funds, we hope to provide some basic infrastructure for these three islands such

as jetties, toilets and gazebos," he told reporters in Pulau Payar, Langkawi, recently.

Mohd Asmirul said he hoped that volunteers from the government and private agencies, as well as non-governmental organisations would initiate steps in realising the state government's plans to make the three islands an important tourism product that could be a source of revenue to the state.

Earlier, he launched the hygiene and cleanliness awareness programme in Pulau Payar, which was attended by Kedah Solid Waste Management and Public Cleansing Corporation (SWCorp) director Zaini Tuah and over 50 volunteers from various agencies.

"Pulau Payar is one of Langkawi's top tourist attractions, so to help keep the beaches clean, we organised a gotong-royong programme with SWCorp, the Fisheries Department and 14 other government and private agencies," he said. — Bernama

Produk susu dari Jerman dirampas

SEPANG - Sebanyak 180 kilogram (kg) produk susu tepung yang diimport dari Jerman bernilai RM5,134 dirampas di Zon Komersial Bebas Lapangan Terbang Antarabangsa Kuala Lumpur (KLIA) di sini Sabtu lepas.

Pengarah Perkhidmatan Kuarantin dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia (MAQIS) Selangor, Dr Tarmisal Alimin dalam satu kenyataan berkata, 18 kotak produk susu tepung itu dirampas kerana tidak mempunyai sijil kesihatan yang sah dari negara asalnya.

"Hasil pemeriksaan pada jam 6.50 petang itu mendapati terdapat 18 kotak susu tepung yang dibawa iaitu seberat 180kg dan dianggarkan bernilai RM5,134.

"Kes akan disiasat di bawah Seksyen 15(1) Akta Perkhidmatan Kuarantin dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia 2011 [Akta

728] iaitu tidak mematuhi syarat import yang boleh dihukum di bawah Seksyen 15(2) akta yang sama.

"Jika disabitkan bersalah mereka boleh didenda tidak melebihi RM100,000 atau dipenjara selama tempoh tidak melebihi enam tahun atau kedua-duanya sekali," katanya.

Tambah Tarmisal, bagi kesalahan kedua atau berikutnya, mereka boleh didenda tidak melebihi RM150,000 atau dipenjarakan selama tempoh tidak melebihi tujuh tahun atau keduă-duanya.

"Pihak MAQIS sentiasa bersedia dalam melakukan tugas di semua pintu masuk negara bagi memastikan komoditi haiwan, pertanian, ikan yang masuk ke dalam negara mematuhi syarat dan peraturan yang ditetapkan," katanya.
