Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Tetap Pertanian dan Industri Asas Tani, Pengangkutan dan Industri Utama Kedah, Azman Nasrudin berkata, projek itu juga bertujuan memberi peluang latihan kepada pelatih dalam aspek penanaman dan pengurusan durian.

Katanya, projek itu juga dapat mempertingkatkan pengeluaran durian melalui pemindahan teknologi daripada Ejen Pengembangan Pertanian.

預防非洲豬瘟

清萊府撲殺200頭豬

(曼谷20日综合电) 泰国北部距离缅甸约30公 里的清莱府美真地区本周 扑杀了200头猪只,以以防非洲猪瘟爆发,泰国政 防密切监控全国各养猪场 的状况,若有疑似非洲猪 瘟将全面扑杀。

中南半岛的越南、寮 国、柬埔寨和缅甸都已经 是非洲猪瘟疫区,泰国 尚未传出疫情。民族报 (The Nation)报导,清 莱当局本周下令扑杀在美 真(Mae Chan)地区约 200头猪。

报导指出,与美真地 区相隔一条河的缅甸大其 力(Tachilek)地区爆发 非洲猪瘟后,缅甸的农民 将死亡猪只丢到河里。清 莱当局扑杀猪只是采取预 防性措施。

清 莱 府 畜 产 局 局长诺彭(Nopporn Mahakantha)表示,已 经把猪只的组织样本送 验,确认有没有感染非洲 猪瘟。

泰国农业部畜产局局长索拉威(Sorawit Thanito)表示,已经要求畜产局密切监控全国各养猪场的状况,如果有猪只出现疑似非洲猪瘟的症状,畜产局会买下全部猪只并扑杀。

泰国公视(Thai PBS)报导,清莱府当局 宣布未来6个月禁止活的 猪只出入清莱府,并在周 边设下12个路检站,全 面防堵非洲猪瘟在泰国爆 发。

BENTONG'S GINGER FARMS UNDER THREAT

Farmers face uncertainty after being told their land will be used for private project

RE the glory days of the Bentong ginger, the country's premier ginger, grown on the hilly slopes of Kampung Bukit Tinggi, near here, coming to an end? Farmers, who had been plant-

ing the rhizome for the past five decades, are facing an uncertain future as they are unable to renew their land permits with the Pahang Forestry Department to continue operating this year. Some 231 farmers have been

operating their farms, which cover 286ha of the hilly slopes of the Bukit Tinggl forest reserve,

They never encountered prob-

lems until early this year, when reminder letters from the Forestry Department to renew their land use permits did not arrive at their doorstep.

The farmers were perplexed when told, at a dialogue session

with a state executive council member to seek clarification about their land status on May 13, that their farms would make way for a private development project and they would instead be given another piece of land to farm on.

The series of development has given rise to concerns among the farmers as they have been work-ing on ginger farms for three generations, and it has been their only source of income.

Although the farmers want to continue working on their piece of land, the act of some individ-

uals, believed to have links with the private company, undertak-ing a survey and painting red markings in certain areas of their farm has left them feeling unSun Chin, whose father was among the first generation of farmers to clear the land and ven-ture into vegetable farming in the 1960s, said he used to help his father plant water spinach

(kangkung air).
The 66-year-old father of one said due to the poor water quality, which was contaminated as the surrounding areas were being developed. their spinach did not grow well, prompting his father, along with the other farmers, to

plant ginger.
"Surprisingly, ginger grew well and everyone began planting

it. During the off sea-son, we planted other vegetables. I can claim to be an expert on ginger. I started with zero knowledge about ginger and still practise traditional farming methods till today.

"Failure to obtain the permit is making us worried. Most of the farmers are elderly and we do not have much time if the government orders us to move elsewhere. Cultivating ginger takes about three years and there will be no income for the first year before we can sell it."

He described plans to relocate

He described plans to relocate

the farmers as being "easier said than done".

Sun said they had been legally operating on the land since 2008 and never expected to face such a dilemma.

"The state government pro-posed a piece of land about an hour from here. That

area is not suitable for ginger plantation as the soil has lots of pebbles.

"Back in the 1970s. people went there to start farming but they did not grow well; its size was only as big as one's palm.

"The new site is sur-rounded by hills and

remains as the 'only site where no one has explored major farming. The farmers here know that the soil there is not suitable to grow ginger, so how do you expect us to move there?" He added that the farmers

would do whatever it took to re-main at the site.

"Time is running out. We are not young and we cannot spend long hours preparing the farm or building infrastructure. Since we have been operating legally, why don't they allow us (to stay on the current land)?"

Farmers' association concerned over private development project

have been operating on their farm plots here that have been described as the "pulse" of ginger farming in the country since

However, when a group of in-dividuals, armed with land surveylng equipment, visited ginger farms at Kampung Bukit Tinggi here on a regular basis early this year, the farmers sensed something amiss.

To worsen matters, they did not eceive the reminder notice from the state Forestry Department to renew their land permit, which they have been paying annually since 2008:

Since the district Forestry Department could not provide the farmers with a satisfactory expla-nation, they held a dialogue with a state executive council mem-ber, who confirmed that the farmers had to move out by next year as the land had been approved for private development.

Bentong Smallholders' Associ-ation chairman Chaw Ngok Ling said farmers at the dialogue as-serted that they were not pre-pared to move out as they had

pared to move out as they had spent a lot of money and energy working on their farms. He said the farmers over the years had raised funds amount-ing to hundreds of thousands of ing to mundreds of thousands of finggit to clear the area, make paths, install pipes for water sup-ply and build roads. The work took three years before they could plant ginger.

"We were informed that a new piece of land had been allocated for us and the developer, (who is taking over the land) will bear the cost to install the basic infras-

The new area is not suitable. Most of the land around Bukit Tinggi is being used for farming,

but no one is doing any activity on that piece of land, except for

on that piece of land, except for some farmers planting spinach on a small scale," he said.

Chaw said they met Forestry Department officers, who said they were only doing their job and the decision concerning the land came under the jurisdiction of the state government.

of the state government. He said before operating on the current land, the farmers had been forced to move on six oc-casions since the 1970s as they

casions since the 1970s as they were farming illegally.

"We were operating in smaller groups and the authorities often cut the ginger trees since we were doing it without approval in Jan-

doing it wincout approval in Janda Balk and here.

"In 2008, the state government awarded a piece of land to the farmers for vegetable and ginger farming, which was a relief for many of us.

"The location is fertile, moist

many of us.

"The location is fertile, moist and rich with tropical soil, allowing for ginger cultivation. The surrounding area has clean and cool air around the 23°C range. Although farmers in other parts

of Pahang plant ginger, the Ben-tong ginger is special as it is rich in nutrients, large in size and re-mains fresh for about a month (after harvest)," he said, adding that Bentong ginger was sold at

RM20 per kg.
Chaw said a majority of the farmers here were above 75 years and had led hard lives, working under the sun and rain to ensure a continuous supply of ginger all

year long.
"If they were to lose their liveli-hood, who is going to hire them? What about the 231 familles who rely on the income from the farms for a living and the younger generation who returned from the city to help their elderly par-ents on the farms?

"We hope the authorities will listen to us and hold dialogues with us so that we can contribute with us so that we can contribute to agro-tourism in Kampung Bukit Tinggi. We have adopted sustainable farming methods. "We are unsure why the author-

lties want development projects to be carried out on the hillslope here."

Younger generation of farmers left in a dilemma

BENTONG: Wong Jing Yi was working at a private firm in Kuala Lumpur when his father-in-law rang him in 2010 to ask if he was

rang him in 2010 to ask if he was interested to work on the family's ginger farm at Kampung Bukit Tinggi near here.
Wong, 36, decided to quit his job in the city in exchange for life on a traditional farm. Everything went smoothly for nine years un-

The father of three, who saw a huge potential in farming, put all his effort into farming but as united the same and over the future certainty loomed over the future of his land, his plans are in jeop-

Wong, a Tunku Abdul Rahman College Business Administration diploma holder, said he decided to give farming a try after his fa-ther-in-law suffered a fall in 2010.

"There was no one to take care of the farm, so I thought why not give it a try. I became engrossed in it and was hoping to expand the popularity of Bentong ginger through agro-tourism. Now, I am uncertain about what lies ahead and whether young farmers would be able to continue work-

ing on the farms.
"News that farmers will not have their permits renewed has

shocked the community here as these farms are inherited across generations. We had been operating here for only 11 years and have to re-locate again. We appeal to the state gov-ernment to allow us remain here."

He said a majority of the villagers here were involved in farming as they did not complete secondary

school education.
"In the 1990s, there were no secondary schools in Bukit

Tinggi and the near-Inggi and the near-est school was in Bentong or Kuala Lumpur. So a major-ity of the villagers completed primary school education be-fore choosing to work fore choosing to work

on the farms. "When the farmers began working on this land in 2008, they spent a lot of money

to build facilities, as the place is steep and accessible only with four-wheel-drive vehi-cles and motorcycles. They slogged hard to prepare the land to ensure ginger and vegetables can grow well," he said, adding that each farmer owned between

that each farmer owned between 1.2ha and 1.6ha of land. Wong said should they lose their livelihood, there was no way the elderly farmers could find alternative jobs or move elsewhere as "farming runs in their veins".

"I can't imagine what will happen if the farms are closed as many people will lose their jobs and face an uncertain future. These are people who have spent their entire lives growing up on farms here. Where do you expect them to go?'
