## Ronald tekad bantu golongan nelayan petani dan penternak terjejas akibat PKP



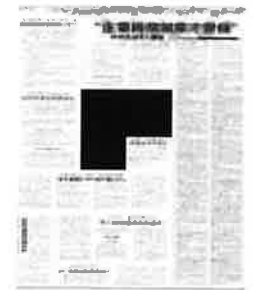
Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee mengadakan mesyuarat khas koordinasi bersama Exco Pertanian Negeri di Putrajaya pada Isnin.

Mesyuarat itu bertujuan membincangkan dan mengambil satu pendekatan yang lebih sistematik dan terperinci, mencari kaedah penyelesaian bagi membantu nelayan, petani dan penternak dalam menghadapi kesukaran menjual hasil susulan Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan berlanjutan sehingga 14 April 2020.

Langkah bersesuaian juga dapat memudahkan masyarakat umum untuk keluar membeli keperluan harian di samping kawalan pencegahan dibuat semasa aktiviti jual beli dijalankan.

# Pulihkan rantai bekalan pertanian

**A**lhamdulillah, kita telah lalu bersama Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) fasa satu selama 14 hari yang pertama. Dalam tempoh ini, kita boleh saksikan baik mereka yang berkeluarga atau merantau mencari rezeki di ibu kota boleh mula bekerja dari rumah atau menghabiskan masa berkualiti dengan memasak, mengemas rumah dan mencuba hobi yang baru.

Dalam tempoh ini juga, rakyat Malaysia termasuk penulis dapat mengalami sendiri pengalaman baharu dalam mendapatkan bekalan makanan dan barangan keperluan rumah. Selaku ketua keluarga, adalah menjadi tugas penulis untuk membeli bekalan bagi rumah dan keluarga. Ada ketika penulis dapat membeli bahan yang dimahukan, ada ketika ia sudah kehabisan stok di pasar raya.

Namun, kita bersyukur kerana kerajaan memberi jaminan bahawa bekalan makanan dan keperluan akan sentiasa mencukupi. Namun, kita tidak boleh menafikan bahawa dengan terhadnya pergerakan rakyat, maka permintaan terhadap produk pertanian seperti ternakan dan sayuran yang sebahagian besarnya mudah rosak dan tidak tahan lama akan terjejas.

Hotel, restoran dan kedai makan adalah sub sektor perkhidmatan yang menjadi pembeli terbesar produk pertanian kini tidak mempunyai keperluan untuk membeli pada kadar biasa sekali gus menjadi penyumbang kepada kejutan permintaan yang berlaku kini.

Selain itu, pelaksanaan PKP juga menyebabkan bilangan mereka yang dapat bekerja dalam sektor pertanian juga dihadkan.

Ini diakui sendiri oleh Setiausaha Persatuan Pekebun Sayuran Cameron Highlands, Chay Ee Mong, apabila pengeluaran sayur-sayuran di Cameron Highlands diturunkan kepada 500 tan metrik sehari daripada 800 tan metrik kebiasaannya.

Sekiranya hasil itu tidak dituai dan dijual, risiko hasil itu akan rosak tingginya dan ia bukan sahaja akan merugikan

pengusaha sektor pertanian malahan dikhuatiri akan menjejaskan terus pengeluaran produk mereka kerana kerugian berterusan.

Maka, kita kini berhadapan dengan dilema kerana kedua-dua pihak, permintaan dan pengeluaran sedang menghadapi masalah dan ia perlu diselesaikan bagi menjamin bekalan makanan dan bahan mentah negara sentiasa mencukupi dan rantai bekalan tidak putus.

## Intervensi

Oleh yang demikian, perlu ada intervensi daripada pihak kerajaan untuk memulihkan rantai bekalan produk pertanian dan memastikan pasaran ini terus berfungsi walaupun negara kini sedang menghadapi cabaran wabak Covid-19. Kerajaan telah memberi jaminan bahawa lori-lori logistik yang membawa bahan makanan tidak akan ditahan dalam sekatan jalan raya.

Kerajaan juga melalui Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan diharapkan dapat segera memobilisasikan agensi seperti FAMA untuk mengambil alih sementara waktu peranan sebagai peraih dan pemborong produk pertanian agar rantai bekalan kepada pengguna

akhir dapat dikekalkan dengan kos yang berpatutan. Ini penting bagi mereka yang tinggal di desa dan pedalaman.

Kita juga tidak boleh menolak kemungkinan bahawa gaya hidup rakyat akan berubah disebabkan wabak Covid-19 ini. Lebih ramai akan membeli-belah melalui e-dagang kerana sudah terbiasa sewaktu PKP berjalan.

Oleh yang demikian, kerajaan seharusnya segera memanfaatkan teknologi komunikasi dan tanpa wayar untuk memudahkan rakyat khususnya mereka yang celik teknologi untuk menggunakan aplikasi e-dagang dan logistik di telefon pintar masing-masing dalam membeli barangan keperluan dan bekalan makanan.

Sekiranya kita merujuk kepada pengumuman Menteri Kanan dan Pertahanan Isnin yang lepas, PKP fasa dua selama 14 hari ini lebih ketat dan had masa operasi bagi pasar raya, pasar, stesen minyak diperkenalkan bagi mengehendak interaksi sesama individu di luar rumah. Mungkin inilah waktu terbaik untuk kerajaan melaksanakan cadangan ini seiring dengan perubahan semasa rakyat.

## Pasar Tani to help keep food supply chain moving – Junz

**KOTA KINABALU:** Agriculture and Food Industry Minister Datuk Junz Wong has brought the plight of Sabahans to Putrajaya's attention via a teleconference on Monday.

According to Junz, this was the first nationwide meeting chaired by his newly appointed Federal counterpart, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee.

"We had a fruitful discussion where I raised the need for Sabah to be able to resume FAMA Pasar Tani operations statewide. And this Pasar Tani will be operated under strict procedures to avoid the spread of Covid-19 at the same time maintain food security and sustain the food supply chain, especially in districts like Tawau, Lahad Datu, Kinabatangan, Keningau, Ranau, Tuaran, Putatan, Tenom, Kota Marudu etc. The Pasar Tani will function as a centre for produce to be sold by farmers and purchased by consumers."

He further said, "We have to look at food security and continuity holistically. Small time farmers and breeders sell their produce periodically. If they are forced to close shop and do not survive this cycle, there won't be a second cycle because many of them won't be able to restart. So we need to plan ahead by helping farmers and breeders in case the Movement Control Order (MCO) is extended."

Junz said, "MAFI who has the list of farmers and breeders can work together with FAMA to collect and sell these produce. Produce throughout Sabah can then be picked up, placed at the Pasar Tani and then marketed to end consumers."

This exercise will drastically reduce unnecessary movements as we are using only FAMA's outfit under strict Covid-19 precautionary supervision."

He added there was also a need for Sabah to procure its own essentials and Ronald lauded the

idea.

"At this moment in time, Putrajaya needs to delegate to Sabah as we can better manage ourselves. I relayed this to Dr Ronald and he will consider it."

"Through experience, buying face masks for example, we were made to wait for a long time and some face masks are still stuck in Peninsular Malaysia due to logistics problems. Meanwhile, similar face masks ordered directly from China have arrived."

"So I see the need for Sabah to manage its own stockpile of essentials like rice, fertilizer and animal feed, especially during the MCO."

These essentials are vital to ensure continuous production of vegetables and animals that we eat as food eventually."

Also during the meeting, it was agreed that traditional fishermen should be allowed to resume daily activities as the Federal Minister will liaise with the National Security Council to not restrict traditional fishermen's activities during the MCO.

Junz assured Sabahans that his ministry would be working closely with Putrajaya to assist farmers, planters and breeders.

"Be rest assured, Dr Ronald and myself will work together to help keep businesses afloat, especially those in the agriculture sector like poultry, chicken, cattle, swine, goat. We are also committed to ensure the continuity of food supply chain for Sabahans."

"So there is no need to panic. We have sufficient food and we are planning ahead."

Together at the teleconference were Dr Mariana Tinggal, Sabah MAFI permanent secretary; Rakam Sijim, political secretary to Sabah MAFI Minister, heads of Department and key officers of Sabah MAFI.

## Minister: FAMA to set up fresh goods markets across Malaysia to prevent crowding during MCO



KUALA LUMPUR, March 31 — The Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (FAMA) will set up markets for fresh and wet goods nationwide, so as to overcome the problem of congestion and crowds at wet markets during the ongoing extended movement control order (MCO) against the Covid-19 pandemic.

Defence Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob said these controlled fresh goods markets will only sell products including fish, meat, fruit and vegetables, unlike ordinary wet markets which also offer items like clothing and dry goods.

"The markets will be established in 77 locations throughout every state. Alongside this, selected farmers' markets (*pasar tani terpilih*) will also be held in 10 locations, and permanent farmers' markets (*pasar tani kekal*)

within buildings at 16 locations," he said during his daily post-National Security Council press conference today.

Ismail Sabri said markets will also be opened in 17 FAMA operations centres throughout the country, three MyFarm outlets including the one in Putrajaya, 24 Farmers' Organisation area complexes, as well as in suitable government department or agency complexes.

"The operating hours for selected farmers' markets are from 8am or 8.30am, to 11am or noon, twice a week. Whereas for farmers' markets the operating hours are from 8am or 8.30am, to 12pm, and can be extended up to 4pm.

"As with existing wet markets, strict standard operating procedures will be in place to stem the spread of Covid-19, including appropriate social distancing and spacing between the stalls by at least one metre apart," he said.

The minister added that FAMA will also sell its products online during this period, and encouraged the public to buy from them.

As of noon today, approximately 2,626 Covid-19 positive cases in Malaysia have been recorded, with 479 recoveries and 37 deaths. Worldwide approximately 786,876 cases have been recorded, with 165,892 recoveries and 37,839 deaths.

## Sabah wants to manage own food stockpile during Covid-19 crisis



KOTA KINABALU: Sabah has asked Putrajaya to allow it to manage its own food stockpile during the Covid-19 crisis. Sabah Minister of Agriculture and Food Industry Junz Wong said the state had experienced delays in procuring "essentials" as they were held up in Peninsular Malaysia.

"In times of crisis like this, Putrajaya needs to delegate to Sabah as we can better manage ourselves. I have relayed this to the federal Agriculture and Food Industries Minister Ronald Kiandee and he will consider it.

"I see a need for Sabah to manage its own stockpile of essentials like rice, fertilisers and animal feed, especially during

the movement control order period.

"These essentials are vital to ensure continuous production of vegetables and meat supplies," he said after a teleconference with Kiandee here today.

Wong also asked the federal government to allow the Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (FAMA) to resume its pasar tani (farmers' market) in the state during the MCO period.

"In districts like Tawau, Lahad Datu, Kinabatangan, Keningau, Ranau, Tuaran, Putatan, Tenom and Kota Marudu, the pasar tani functions as a centre for produce to be sold by farmers and purchased by consumers," he said.

He also said both he and Kiandee agreed that traditional fishermen should be allowed to resume their work, adding that Kiandee would talk to the National Security Council to allow them to fish while the MCO was in effect.
