Minister of Agriculture and Food Industry (MOA) Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee said the establishment of the PST during the period of the Movement Control Order (MCO) was to continue ensuring sufficient food for the people.

In addition, it is also to help the front-line workers in the food industry sell their produce.

"Among the problems faced (by the public, fishermen, farmers and livestock farmers) during the MCO period are the number of business outlets closed, besides the supermarkets which were allowed to operate."

"So the PST was created under the concept of a supermarket, complete with the aspect of health screening to help the public and the frontline workers of the national food industry," he said during a Ruang Bicara programme entitled 'COVID-19: Food Safety Assurance', tonight.

The Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (FAMA) had so far opened 44 PST locations while the Farmers' Organisation (LPP) has 17 PST locations nationwide, with 36 more PST locations to be opened in stages.

Kiandee said among the PST fresh produce on sale were vegetables, fruits, poultry, fish, meat, groceries and agricultural produce.

He said the PST was also set up to curb the issue of dumping fresh goods, including vegetables and fruits as they were not sold due to the MCO, while guaranteeing that the government would continue to ensure that food supply and food security remained at their best levels.

KOTA KINABALU: Steps are already in place for highland vegetables from Kundasang to be transported to the main markets in Sabah, Sarawak, Brunei and Peninsular Malaysia, says state Agriculture and Food Industry Minister Datuk Junz Wong.

A mechanism has been put in place that will allow 58 farmers and wholesalers from the Kundasang area to send out their produce to Kota Kinabalu and the east coast towns of Sandakan and Tawau.

Approvals have also been given to 148 entities and 184 lorries to transport the goods from Kundasang following initial logistics hiccups after the movement control order was put in place on March 18.

Wong said the Ranau district office was put in charge to ensure guidelines were observed and the police would not stop the movements of vegetables and other food items between districts. The exports of highland vegetables to Brunei, Sarawak and the peninsula would not be interrupted, he said.

He was commenting on a claim by farmer Jailin Nazrin that vegetables could not be sent
