Kerajaan jamin bekalan ikan mencukupi sepanjang PKP

KUANTAN - Kerajaan memberi jaminan bekalan ikan mencukupi sepanjang tempoh Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) yang dilanjutkan sehingga 28 April ini.

Jaminan tersebut berdasarkan aktiviti penangkapan, pendaratan dan pembekalan ikan yang berjalan seperti biasa di seluruh Malaysia tanpa sekatan ketika ini.

Timbalan Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan II, Datuk Che Abdullah Mat Nawi berkata, stok bekalan ikan dan hasil laut dalam negara juga konsisten serta mencukupi di pasaran dengan jumlah sebanyak 185,000 tan metrik sebulan berbanding keperluan semasa sebanyak 155,000 tan metrik sebulan.

“Namun, kerajaan akan melihat dan memastikan masalah dalam rangkaian pemasaran diselesaikan serta perlu diperkemaskan supaya bekalan yang mencukupi ini sampai kepada rakyat.

“Jadi, rakyat tidak perlu risau atau panik berhubung perkara ini kerana pengeluaran ikan berterusan seperti biasa walaupun ketika PKP ini,” katanya pada sidang media sempena lawatan kerja beliau di Kompleks Lembaga Kemajuan Ikan Malaysia (LKIM) Kuantan di sini.

Menurutnya, kementerian turut membuka bilik gerakan bagi menyele-

saikan masalah yang berkaitan sumber makanan termasuk harga, lambakan dan logistik.

“Kita akan selesaikan masalah yang berbangkit dalam perkara ini, namun setakat ini tiada masalah besar yang berlaku.

“Isu pemasaran ikan ketika tempoh PKP ini juga tidak timbul kerana adanya perkhidmatan pembelian secara dalam talian yang disediakan pelbagai pihak.

“Ia dilihat sebagai satu pembaharuan dalam pemasaran bahan makanan yang memudahkan pengguna untuk mendapatkan barang keperluan,” katanya.

Selain itu, beliau berkata, Lembaga Pemasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (FAMA) juga mempunyai kaedah pemasaran untuk membantu rakyat termasuk melalui kewujudan Pasar Segar Terkawal yang dibuka di seluruh Malaysia.

Timbalan Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan II, Datuk Che Abdullah Mat Nawi, berkata pada masa kedudukan stok ikan dan hasil laut negara adalah sebanyak 185,000 tan metrik sebulan.

"Berbanding dengan keperluan semasa berjumlah 155,000 tan metrik sebulan. Kita ada lebih 30,000 tan, jadi tiada masalah.

Justeru, kita memberi jaminan bekalan makanan ikan mencukupi untuk negara.

"Namun memerlukan rantaian pemasaran yang perlu diselesaikan supaya bekalan ini sampai kepada rakyat. Apa yang penting rakyat tidak perlu membuat pembelian panik," katanya ketika ditemui selepas mengadakan lawatan kerja ke Kompleks Lembaga Kemajuan Ikan Malaysia (LKIM) Kuantan di Kemunting di sini, hari ini.

Beliau berkata, walaupun tempoh PKP disambung, stok bekalan ikan tetap mencukupi kerana nelayan serta semua pihak yang berkaitan masih dibenarkan beroperasi.

Sehubungan itu, beliau berkata pihak kementerian juga sudah membuka bilik gerakan bagi menyelesaikan pelbagai permasalahan yang berkaitan pemakanan baik dari segi harga, lambakan dan masalah dalam penghantaran.

"Tetapi setakat ini tidak ada masalah besar, kebanyakannya adalah masalah kecil sahaja dan kita sudah selesaikan satu persatu. Rakyat tidak perlu bimbang," katanya.

Sementara itu, jumlah pendaratan ikan di Kompleks LKIM di seluruh negara sepanjang tempoh PKP bermula 8 Mac hingga 8 april lalu adalah 16,631 tan metrik dengan nilai RM59.02 juta.

"Di LKIM Kuantan pula, jumlah tangkapan ikan dalam tempoh yang sama adalah sebanyak 4,635 tan metrik dengan nilai RM10.36 juta. Purata pendaratan ikan sehari adalah 211 tan metrik," katanya.

Katanya lagi, LKIM Kuantan juga mengambil pelbagai inisiatif bagi membolehkan satu prosedur operasi standard (SOP) yang bersesuaian dapat dijalankan di kompleks ini sepanjang tempoh PKP berlangsung.

"Bermula dari pintu masuk, peruncit dan pemborong disaring dari segi kesihatan dan hanya yang mempunyai lesen dibenarkan masuk selain diberi selang masa yang tertentu untuk mengurus niaga secara berperingkat," katanya.

STOK ikan dan hasil laut dalam negara ini dijamin mencukupi termasuk jika Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) bersambung, kata Timbalan Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan II, Datuk Che Abdullah Mat Nawi.

Beliau berkata, ketika ini bekalan hasil laut negara mencapai 185,000 tan metrik sebulan, berbanding keperluan semasa yang sekitar 155,000 tan metrik sebulan.

"Kita ada lebih 30,000 tan, jadi tiada masalah. Justeru kita memberi jaminan bekalan makanan ikan mencukupi untuk negara.

"Namun memerlukan rangkaian pemasaran (terbaik) yang perlu diselesaikan supaya bekalan ini sampai kepada rakyat. Apa yang penting rakyat tidak perlu membuat pembelian panik," katanya.

National stock of fish supply exceeds demand

KUANTAN: The national stock of fish supply is sufficient and consistent, with supply exceeding demand, said Deputy Agriculture and Food Industry Minister II Datuk Che Abdullah Mat Nawi.

"The current stock of fish and marine produce supply in the country is 185,000 metric tonnes a month compared to current needs of 155,000 metric tonnes a month," he said.

Speaking to reporters after inspecting the operations at the Fisheries Development Authority of Malaysia (LKIM) complex here today, Che Abdullah said as such, the issue of insufficient supply of fish does not arise as permission has been given to fishermen and the entire supply chain to operate as usual during the Movement Control Order (MCO) period.

He added that the price of fish in the market was stable and there was no significant increase (in price) while the ministry had created a special team to monitor the supply, price and marketing of food items including marine produce.

Che Abdullah also said to help the public buy fish, 36 fishermen associations throughout the country will be marketing their produce directly to consumers.

On his visit to the LKIM complex, Che Abdullah said it was a one-stop centre which provided various facilities such as landing jetty, auction space, wholesale area and processing site.

"I understand that the marine produce here is not only marketed in Pahang, but also bought by wholesalers to be sold in Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, Melaka, Negeri Sembilan and Kelantan," he said. - Bernama

副农长：供应链如常 管控令延长不怕没鱼吃

（关丹 10 日讯）农业及食品工业部第二副部长拿督仄阿都拉派定心丸，国内渔获供应足够，消费者不必担心没有鱼吃，即使行动管控令再度延长。

他说，渔获缺货问题不存在，因渔夫获批出海作业，及整个渔业供应链，在这行动管控令期间如常运作。

他是今日前往大马渔业发展局关丹分局巡视码头后，如是对媒体发言。

他说，“国内渔获及供应稳定，即每月 18 万 5000 公吨供应量，相对每月 15 万 5000 公吨的需求量。”

因此，他表示，人民不需要担心，也不必购买或大量囤货，因为供应是持续及足够的，即便在行管令期间。

他说，为了方便消费者获取海产，国内 36 个渔民协会已进行“货付现款 (COD)”市场策略服务，而受欢迎海鲜鱼类包括甘望鱼、硬尾鱼、马鲛鱼、鲷鱼及石斑鱼、虾及苏东等。

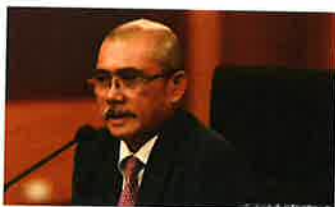

KUCHING: The state government has set aside RM1.5mil for the Sarawak Farmers Organisation to buy produce from smallholders.

Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Amar Douglas Uggah Embas said the government acknowledged the fact that with the Covid-19 pandemic and the enforcement of the movement control order, farmers and fishermen faced problems in selling their produce and catch, and this had greatly impacted their incomes.

"Thus, the state government through the Agriculture Department has come forward to address the issue, by setting aside RM1.5 mil to the Sarawak Farmers Organisation.

"The amount will be channelled to all farmers' organisations statewide.

Uggah, who is also Agriculture Modernisation, Native Land and Regional Development Minister, urged farmers to approach the two organisations in order to sell their produce. In turn, these organisations would bring their produce and catch to the markets.

"As a matter of fact, farmers and fishermen in Betong, Samarahan, Meradong, Sibul, Limbang, Bintulu and Miri, among others, have done this.

"So please contact your nearest farmers' organisation and Fama offices.

"Similarly, for the fishermen, the government has allocated a sum of RM600,000 to Lembaga Kemajuan Ikan Malaysia for it to buy their catch.



Use social media to market produce, pineapple farmers urged

JOHOR BARU: Pineapple farmers are encouraged to make use of social media as a marketing platform for them to sell their products and not depend entirely on wholesalers.

This is after a large supply of pineapples produced by farmers went to waste as logistics and sales have been restricted under the movement control order (MCO).

Farmer and founder of Fionanas (M) Sdn Bhd Iskandar Zulkarnain, 47, said that farmers should work extra hard during these trying times in order to survive and stay in business.

"The oversupply was due to lack of mobility during the restriction order and because fewer people are coming out.

"As such, we have to be more aggressive in terms of marketing, especially on social media so that we can continue to generate sales and income," he said, adding that he had started selling pineapples door-to-door using Cash on Delivery (COD) method.

Iskandar, who owns a pineapple plantation in Pontian said the current market price for pineapples had also dropped due to the oversupply.

"Some of the farmers have sold their fruits for 50sen per kg. The usual price is RM2.50 to RM3.50 per kg for MD2 variety.

"Johor Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (Fama) has also lent a helping hand by buying the fruits for RM2.10 per kg from the farmers affected," he said.

Another farmer, Khalit Kasmoin, 63, said that sales for MD2 has not been affected, unlike the Moris and Josapine variety.

"We are now depending on COD to sell our products to continue generating income.

"There are no issues for the MD2 variety as the demand has remained high. The oversupply is for Moris and Josapine variety as these two types of pineapples are not suitable for direct consumption and requires processing," he added.

Khalit said he currently sells 300kg of MD2 pineapples through COD.

Meanwhile, farmer and founder of Jutawan Agriculture Products (M) Sdn Bhd, Sih Huay Heng, 51, said market price for MD2 had dropped.

"The standard price for MD2 is RM2.50 but now the price has gone down but we can still manage to go on.

"Nowadays we do business through deliveries or walk-in for those living in the Pontian area," he said.

"We usually export our products to China, Japan and the Middle East but since the MCO started, we have been channeling our produce to Kelantan, Terengganu and Kuala Lumpur," he said, adding that demand for pineapples in the local market was still high.

Drop in demand for Cameron Highlands veggies despite adequate supply

KUANTAN: The demand for Cameron Highlands fresh vegetables has seen a drop ever since the Movement Control Order (MCO) came into effect on March 18.

The MCO which saw the closure of night markets (pasar malam), farmers' market (pasar tani) and some restaurants nationwide, resulted in wholesalers choosing to buy in smaller quantities to avoid losses.

Cameron Highlands Vegetable Growers Association secretary Chay Ee Mong said wholesalers and retailers had decided to cut down their orders saying there was lesser demand in the supply chain.

"Previously, wholesalers used to order vegetables weighing about 100kg in a day, but now they have reduced to only 60kg a day. The open markets including morning markets and night markets are closed while most restaurants prefer not to buy a lot of vegetables since there was no dining in.

"Since there is a drop in customers, wholesalers and retailers choose to buy in much smaller quantities. Even then, there have been incidences where farmers are forced to throw away unsold vegetables," he said when contacted today.

Chay said logistics and transportation services which had been an issue during the early days of the MCO had been resolved, and there had been no shortage of supply from some 2,300 vegetable farms in the area.

Meanwhile, he said even the wholesalers operating at the Selayang wholesale market (Pasar Borong Selayang) have started to reduce their orders.

"They have started to limit the number of lorries (carrying vegetables) entering the premises and fearing the Covid-19 outbreak, they even imposed strict control over the workers at the premises. Rather than suffering losses due to unsold vegetables, they have decided to significantly reduce their orders," he said.

Kampung Raja vegetable farmer V. Paneselvam said limited business operation hours under the MCO from 7am to 7pm forced the farmers to start packing their fresh produce early.

He said previously the lorries would only start moving late at night to the Selayang wholesale market or other parts of the country.

"Nowadays, the lorries will leave by 7pm, so farmers have to ensure their vegetables are packed and prepared early or else they will not be able to sell them. Due to the MCO, there are limited number of lorries operating and they have to obtain a special permit to transport the vegetables.

"There is no shortage of vegetable supplies from Cameron Highlands and at times we have to throw the unsold ones away. We are prepared to donate but lack of transportation and restricted vehicle movements leave us with no choice," he said.

Tanah Rata assemblyman Chiong Yoke Kong said the closure of open markets and restaurants had tremendously affected the sales of fresh vegetables from Cameron Highlands.

"Even the wet markets have limited operating hours. However, farmers are operating as usual and there is definitely no shortage.

"Online selling platforms have started to assist the farmers here to sell their fresh produce. Even e-hailing services have started transporting vegetables to customers but these services are only available in big towns," he said.

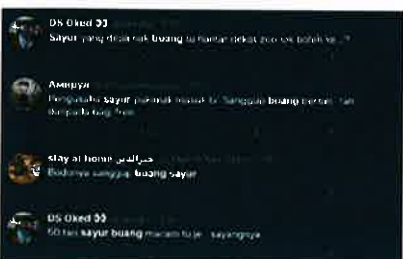
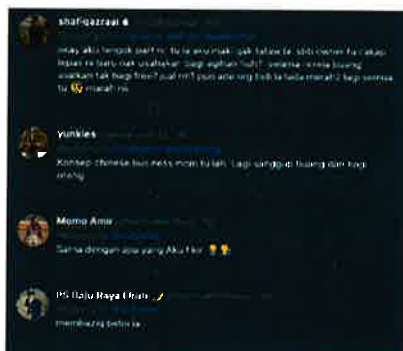

Agriculture, services sectors see highest percentage of job losses



PETALING JAYA: The agriculture (21.9%) and services (15%) sectors recorded the highest percentage of job losses due to the Covid-19 outbreak, according to a special survey "Effects of Covid-19 on Economy and Individuals" by the Statistics Department.

Chief statistician Malaysia Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Uzir Mahidin said for the agriculture sector, 33.0% of workers in the fisheries sub-sector reported job losses, followed by 21.1% in agriculture & plantation.

In the services sector, job losses in the food & beverage services sub-sector recorded 35.4%, followed by the transport & storage subsector with 18.7%.

Meanwhile, almost half (46.6%) of self-employed respondents reported losing their jobs due to the Covid-19 outbreak, while an estimated nine out of 10 respondents are still working with lower than usual salary.

In terms of financial savings, more than two-thirds (71.4%) of self-employed respondents have sufficient savings for less than one month. Only 6.2% of respondents said they are less affected and 52.6% of respondents informed that they are financially most affected.

About 69.7% of those who have worked for less than a year said their financial savings may only support less than a month, whereas 11.4% of those working for 21-30 years and 11.7% working over 30 years had sufficient financial savings up to four months.

The majority of respondents said they are unprepared if the duration of the movement control order was extended, except for employees under government-linked companies and multinational companies.

"The findings of this survey will assist the Malaysian government and people in addressing the effects of Covid-19 on the economy and employment. The assessments are based on respondents who participated in the special survey and do not signify the views of all Malaysians. Therefore, it should be interpreted carefully to assess the effects of Covid-19 in Malaysia as it is not the official statistics. However, it can be used to support the current state of matters," Uzir said in a statement today.

A total of 168,182 respondents aged 15 years and above participated in the online survey from March 23 to 31, 2020.

He added that the Prihatin Rakyat economic stimulus package is expected to facilitate these affected groups that will improve the economy by generating disposable income as well as increasing the domestic consumption.
