Farmers must continue planting to ensure food security

DESPITE the difficulty faced by farmers over the movement control order (MCO), it is important that farmers continue to plant, stresses Kuala Lumpur and Selangor Fruit Farmers Association (KLSFTA) chairman Jeffrey Choong.

This is to ensure food security in the near future, says Choong: "We would like to request farmers not to stop planting; they need to continue. Otherwise, there might be a shortage."

He predicts that if farmers do not continue to plant over the MCO, there is a possibility that there will be fewer supply of fruits in the coming three months to a year.

"Some workers also do not want to work at this time as they are afraid [of Covid-19]. We have offered to pay them more but some of them are still worried, and of course I cannot force them," he explains. "There are also fewer packing staff. We are facing this problem."

Choong adds that some farmers choose not to plant due to other issues like difficulty securing the necessary machinery, piping and irrigation hardware, or accessing fertiliser.

On April 3, Deputy Agriculture and Food Industries Minister L. Datuk Seri Ahmad Hanzah assured the public that there will be enough supply of food and agricultural produce during the MCO as the government has implemented measures to ensure that the supply

chain would not be disrupted. The government has also said that food supply sectors and its chain of essential services can operate as usual.

On a positive note, problems on the distribution of produce that farmers faced at the beginning of the MCO have now been resolved, Choong notes.

Initially there was some confusion due to communication issues but these have been ironed out.

"There are no more issues with access as [Agriculture and Food Industry Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiasu] has clarified it," he says.

However, other barriers are still there.

"There are many fruits that cannot be sold, for example papayas and watermelons. We can pick the fruits but there is not enough transportation to move the produce," he says.

Choong gives examples of lorries which require repair and maintenance but cannot be fixed as many vehicle repair shops are either closed or only partially open, and spare parts are limited due to the MCO.

"Some fruits do not last long, and if they don't arrive on time we have to dispose of them," he says.

Demand has also slowed as hawkers centres, restaurants and shops have closed or are operating in limited hours over the MCO. Members of the public are also afraid to go out to

purchase the items, he adds.

Choong estimates that about 30-50% of fruits produced have to be disposed of as they have gone bad.

He proposes for government agencies like the Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (Fama) to purchase unsold fruits and vegetables from farmers and distribute them to frontliners and the needy.

"We feel this will help both farmers and society," says Choong.

Federation of Malaysian Vegetable Farmers Association president Tan So Tiok meanwhile has

requested for a targeted stimulus package to assist farmers who are badly affected over the MCO following the spread of Covid-19.

"Vegetable farmers had to dispose of 20-30% of our produce. We have also donated some to the needy," he says.

If conditions do not improve, vegetable farmers stand to face a total loss of RM22.75m within the first 28 days of MCO, Tan had said in a letter to the Agriculture Department dated March 30. The letter also included a plea for the government

to provide an incentive on vegetable production of RM90 per metric ton, as the incentive given by the government in 2008 of RM81 per metric ton had greatly reduced farmers' burdens.

Under the recently unveiled special stimulus package worth RM10bil aimed at small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) in a bid to soften the impact of the MCO, only farmers who are registered as SMEs will get financial assistance. The Bantuan Prihatin Nasional cash aid, however, is available for individual farmers based on their income levels.

On Monday, the Perak government launched its RM1m AgroPrihatin scheme to help farmers.

"Demand is less at this time, and the hours of operation of shops and restaurants are also shorter. Many wet markets and night markets are also not operating," says Tan.

Despite the temporary wastage, Tan nevertheless echoes the advice of Choong for farmers to continue planting crops.

"We hope that farmers will not cut production as there may not be enough fresh produce for the market in future. Hari Raya Puasa is coming up, and demand usually increases then," he says.

"It will be difficult to increase import as other countries are also limiting their export. Covid-19 really does impact the market."

61 Controlled Fresh Markets record RM11 mln sales – Kiandee

KUALA LUMPUR: The 61 Controlled Fresh Market (PST) locations established nationwide, as of Thursday, have recorded a total sale of more than RM11 million.

Minister of Agriculture and Food Industry (MOA) Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee said the establishment of the PST during the period of the Movement Control Order (MCO) was to continue ensuring sufficient food for the people.

In addition, it is also to help the front-line workers in the food industry sell their produce.

"Among the problems faced (by the public, fishermen, farmers and livestock farmers) during the MCO period are the number of business outlets closed, besides the supermarkets which were allowed to operate.

"So the PST was created under the concept of a supermarket, complete with the aspect of health screening to help the public and the frontline workers of the national food industry," he said during a Ruang Bicara programme titled 'Covid-19: Food Safety Assurance', on Bernama TV here, Thursday night.

The Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (FAMA) had so far opened 44 PST locations while the Farmers' Organisation (LPP) has 17 PST locations nationwide, with 36

more PST locations to be opened in stages.

Kiandee said among the PST fresh produce sales were vegetables, fruits, poultry, fish, meat, groceries and agricultural produce.

He said the PST was also set up to curb the issue of dumping fresh goods, including vegetables and fruits as they were not sold due to the MCO, while guaranteeing that the government would continue to ensure that food supply and food security remained at their best levels.

"The government through the MOA and agencies under the ministry will continue to take steps to facilitate the delivery, sale, retail, wholesale and so on to ensure that food items remain in every Malaysian home."

"To date, the Ministry of International Trade and Industry has granted approval to operate more than four thousand factories throughout the MCO period including those related to the food industry, including processing and seafood factories, plastic packing factories and so on," he said.

Meanwhile, Stakeholder Management SOIS24.7 director Alya Syahida Alias said that people and non-governmental organisations (NGOs) must know of the things needed by the person and group they want to donate or contribute to, to avoid food waste problem. - Bernama

Kota Belud padi-planting not disrupted

KOTA BELUD: Padi-planting activities in Kota Belud, Sabah's rice bowl area, are being conducted without any disruptions since the Movement Control Order (MCO) was imposed on March 18, director of the Kota Belud Integrated Agricultural Development Area (IADA), Salmah Labulla said.

She said operations in the 8,500-hectare padi area under Kota Belud IADA were as usual after the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industry through the Padi and Rice Industry Division issued a circular stating that agriculture activities could be conducted during the MCO period.

"Initially, everyone was afraid to operate as usual. However, after getting the circular, our agencies, including the farmers have carried on with their activities as usual. The padi mills here are also operating.

"However, currently, most of the padi-growing areas in Kota Belud are at the growing, not harvesting, stage. There are not many activities going on. The

farmers need only carry out activities like spraying pesticide, monitoring water flow and weed growth," she told Bernama.

Salmah added that although there have not been any complaints from the farmers, they had difficulty getting agricultural goods as the shops selling them were closed during the MCO period.

However the Kota Belud IADA had applied to the district office to allow these shops to operate during certain specified hours, she said.

Salmah added that the Kota Belud Farmers' Association also played a role in sending fertiliser to the villages to be distributed to the farmers.

"The IADA Kota Belud will also write to the state government to ask for masks to protect the farmers," she said.

Salmah also said the self-sufficiency level for padi production was only 30 per cent, but operations must continue so as to ensure sufficient padi supply.

Jelapang padi Sabah teruskan aktiviti pertanian

KOTA BELUD - Jelapang padi Sabah di sini terus beroperasi tanpa sebarang halangan sepanjang tempoh Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) yang berkuat kuasa sejak 18 Mac lalu.

Pengarah Kawasan Pembangunan Pertanian Bersepadu (IADA) Kota Belud, Salmah Labulla berkata, kawasan tanaman padi seluas 8,500 hektar di bawah pemantauan IADA Kota Belud beroperasi seperti biasa apabila pesawah turut kelihatan menjalankan aktiviti menanam padi dan membajak sawah, selain menuai hasil tanaman.

Menurutnya, operasi jelapang padi Sabah diteruskan selepas Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan peringkat Persekutuan melalui Bahagian Industri Padi dan Beras mengeluarkan surat pekeliling yang menyatakan bahawa aktiviti pertanian itu boleh diteruskan dalam tempoh PKP.

“Cuma pada tempoh ini kebanyakan kawasan tanaman padi Kota Belud sedang di peringkat penanaman dan bukan penuaian.

“Tidak banyak aktiviti dilakukan. Pesawah hanya melakukan kerja-kerja penjagaan padi,” katanya kepada *Bernama* di sini semalam.
