Maritim rampas 1.3 tan ikan, tahan tiga nelayan tempatan

GEORGE TOWN - Hajat tiga nelayan tempatan untuk mengaut keuntungan lumayan dengan menangkap ikan di kawasan yang tidak dibenarkan tidak kesampaian selepas mereka ditahan Maritim Malaysia (APMM) di kedudukan 1.6 batu nautika Barat Daya Tanjung Chut di sini semalam.

Nelayan yang terdiri daripada seorang tekong bot bersama dua awak-awak yang masing-masing berusia 48, 52 dan 56 tahun itu ditahan dalam Ops Pertiwi/Ops Benteng di sekitar perairan Pulau Pinang kira-kira pukul 8.50 pagi. Pengarah Maritim Negeri,

Kepten Maritim Hamizan Harun berkata, semasa operasi dijalankan kesemua nelayan terbabit berada di atas bot berkenaan.

"Hasil pemeriksaan, lanjut, mereka disyaki telah melakukan kesalahan di bawah Seksyen 8(b) Akta Perikanan 1985 kerana melanggar syarat lesen iaitu melakukan aktiviti menangkap ikan di kawasan yang tidak dibenarkan.

"Dalam operasi tersebut, kita turut menyita 1,300 kilogram ikan pelbagai jenis, enam tong ikan, bot dan satu pukat tunda," katanya di sini semalam.

Menurut beliau, tekong dan

dua awak-awak kemudiannya dibawa ke Jeti Pasukan Polis Maritim di Batu Uban untuk diserahkan kepada pegawai penyiasat bagi tindakan lanjut.

Tegasnya, pihak berkuasa tidak akan berkompromi dengan mana-mana pihak yang melanggar undang-undang perairan negara.

Justeru beliau berkata, orang ramai diminta untuk memberi kerjasama sekiranya terdapat sebarang aduan atau kecemasan di laut melalui talian 24 Jam iaitu MERS 999 atau hubungi Pusat Operasi Maritim Pulau Pinang: 04-2626146 atau 04-264 3650.

斯湾 (Walvis Bay) 的鹈鹕角 (Pelican Point) 海岸，近日被空拍到海滩上布满海豹宝宝尸体，专家研判，这些海豹宝宝应是早产后马上死亡，死后尸体被冲上海滩，海洋保育组织也直呼：“我们正处于一场灾难的中心”

隶属该组织的专家葛来德利 (Tess Gridley) 指出，原本11月中旬到12月时，有一波海豹宝宝出生潮，但今年却异常出现大量婴儿死亡率，初步研判可能与饥饿有关。葛来德利表示，其实从今年8月，就有科学家观察到海豹宝宝异常死亡的状况，而且到了10月来到死亡高峰。科学家认为，有可能该区域的鱼群大量短缺，造

成海豹失去了最主要食物来源，也因此许多海豹妈妈无法吃饱，最后造成大量早产弃养与死胎的状况。

不过专家也表示，除了饿死是导致海豹宝宝大量死亡的原因之一，也不能排除可能有传染病或中毒的状况。目前纳米比亚渔业部 (Ministry of Fisheries)，正在调查海豹宝宝大量死亡的原因。

据悉纳米比亚在1994年也发生类似悲剧，当时也是因为食物来源缺乏，导致海豹饥饿，最后鹈鹕角的海豹数量减少了约3分之1。

FAMA Johor mohon pasar tani dibenar beroperasi

JOHOR BAHRU - Lembaga Pemasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (FAMA) Johor memohon agar pasar tani di bawah pentadbiran pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) di negeri itu yang diarahkan tutup sementara dibenarkan untuk kembali beroperasi dalam tempoh terdekat.

Pengarahnya, Shahrizan Sudiman berharap PBT dapat mempertimbangkan perkara itu dan pihaknya sentiasa bersedia sekiranya terdapat tambahan prosedur operasi standard (SOP) baharu dalam mencegah penularan wabak Covid-19.

Beliau berkata, hal itu dibangkitkan kerana pihaknya mendapat maklum balas daripada peniaga yang terkesan berikutan arahan penutupan itu.

“Kita akur susulan (penularan wabak Covid-19), tetapi kita harap rintihan dan keluhan daripada peniaga ini dipertimbangkan.

“Dari segi kawalan, kita akan patuh. Sekiranya tempoh masa tidak boleh berniaga dihadkan sampai jam 12 tengah hari, kita akan patuh termasuk terhadap sebarang SOP tambahan,” katanya ketika ditemui pemberita di Pasar Tani Kekal Datin Halimah di sini semalam.

Shahrizan diminta mengulas mengenai arahan penutupan sementara operasi semua pasar malam, pasar pagi, pasar khas, Bazar Johor Bahru, termasuk empat pasar tani (bukan Pasar Tani Kekal) bermula 16 Oktober lalu. -*Bernama*

Return 'financial rights' to Sabah — Jeffrey Kitingan

KOTA KINABALU: Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Seri Panglima Dr Jeffrey Kitingan wants the federal government to channel more funding for major developments in Sabah to help resolve the worsening floods.

In a statement released here yesterday, the Agriculture and Food Industry Minister said that while the state has the power to do many things, funding for major developments still depends on the federal government.

"If the federal government gives us our financial rights, our revenue rights, maybe we would have enough funds to solve some of these (flood) problems.

For example, to return 40 per cent of Sabah's net revenue to the state as stated in Schedule 10, Article 112 of the Federal Constitution, collect 5 per cent sales tax on petroleum products

in Sabah, and perhaps even give us their share of 5 per cent cash payment which they had been receiving under the Petroleum Development Act 1974.

"These extra monies would add to our capacity to deal with this (flood). Otherwise, we will forever be asking for money to solve our problems," he said.

Jeffrey visited some of the places affected by floods following heavy downpour on Monday and received a briefing on site from the Department of Drainage and Irrigation director Jeffrey Ng. Jeffrey said he is satisfied that works are being done to alleviate the problem with a comprehensive plan worth RM3 billion already in place.

"We need to do this comprehensively, not bits and pieces because if you do so, you will be chasing the problem rather

than confronting it," he said.

Among the areas visited was Tenghilan, about 55 km from Kota Kinabalu, which had been hit hard by the Monday flooding.

Shopowners were seen still struggling to clean their respective shops after water rose almost three feet in some areas.

Jeffrey said this was the second time the town was flooded this month and department officers would be investigating the source upstream to find out the cause.

"The villagers were really affected by this. They lost their businesses; some of their electrical appliances were damaged.

"They didn't tell me how much losses they have incurred, but I pity them because even now, they cannot run their businesses properly as they are still busy cleaning up," he said
