MAFI sasar pengeluaran 3,336 tan mentrik harumanis tahun ini



SEPANG – Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan (MAFI) menerusi Jabatan Pertanian menyasarkan pengeluaran mangga harumanis sebanyak 3,336 tan metrik dengan nilai RM66.7 juta di Perlis, pada tahun ini.

Menterinya, Datuk Seri Ronald Kiandee berkata, daripada jumlah itu, dianggarkan sekitar 50 peratus akan dijual secara dalam talian melalui platform e-dagang seperti airasia food, airasia fresh dan agrobazaar online.

“Dengan langkah ini secara tidak langsung, ia turut memberi peluang kepada lebih ramai peniaga untuk menyertai aktiviti mempromosikan industri agro makanan ini, menerusi platform e-dagang yang tersedia,” katanya dalam sidang akhbar selepas menyempurnakan majlis flag-off harumanis ke Sabah di Lapangan Terbang Antarabangsa Kuala Lumpur (klia2) hari ini.

Turut hadir, Pengerusi Eksekutif Airasia Group, Datuk Kamarudin Meranun dan Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif Airasia Group, Tan Sri Tony Fernandes.

Ronald berkata, industri harumanis bukan sahaja dapat meningkatkan pendapatan kepada 2,415 pengusaha buah mangga itu di Perlis, malah mempunyai impak besar terhadap ekonomi serta industri agro pelancongan dan rantai bekalan di seluruh negara.

Dalam masa sama, Ronald turut menggalakkan penglibatan lebih banyak syarikat swasta dalam bersama-sama memacu industri harumanis yang dilihat berpotensi tinggi seperti yang dilakukan anak syarikat Airasia, airasia farm.

“MAFI berbesar hati kerana dapat bekerjasama dengan sektor swasta seperti airasia farm untuk mempromosi kempen ‘Harumanis Kembali Lagi.’

“Kerjasama itu bukan sahaja akan memperluas pendedaran harumanis ke seluruh Malaysia tetapi juga membawa buah mangga yang cukup eksklusif ini ke Sabah secara rasmi buat pertama kalinya sejajar dengan penekanan kementerian terhadap sektor pertanian bernilai tinggi yang dapat mewujudkan peluang ekonomi untuk rakyat,” katanya.

Sementara itu, Tony Fernandes berkata, penghantaran pertama harumanis sebagai komoditi eksport adalah dengan memanfaatkan ekosistem dan teknologi kumpulan airasia seperti Teleport, dan penggunaan platform e-dagang oleh airasia food dan airasia fresh.

Penghantaran pertama yang membawa Harumanis berlepas dari Lapangan Terbang Antarabangsa Kuala Lumpur 2 (Klia2) melalui penerbangan AirAsia AK5104 pada jam 10.25 pagi semalam.

Sabahans can now buy Harumanis without flying to Perlis

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KUALA LUMPUR: The trademarked Harumanis from Perlis, a popular seasonal mango reputed for its "double chin" and sweet flesh, has been introduced to Sabahans by airasia farm.

The Harumanis season, from April to June, hit the sky with half a tonne of the mangoes being shipped to the Land Below the Wind on an AirAsia flight yesterday morning from klia2 to Kota Kinabalu.

AirAsia's e-commerce platform, airasia farm, is now an official distributor of Harumanis through its cooperation with the Agriculture and Food Industries Ministry.

Its minister Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee said the ministry was expecting the Harumanis harvest this year to reach 3,336 tonnes, estimated to value at RM66.7mil.

"We anticipate about 50% will be sold online through the e-commerce platforms such as airasia food, airasia fresh and agrobazaar online.

"Therefore, the ministry's cooperation with airasia farm will not only broaden the distribution of Harumanis to the whole of Malaysia but also take these exclusive mangoes to Sabah for the first time on such a large scale," he said.

He added that this would increase the income of more than 2,400 farmers in Perlis and leave a significant impact on the economy as well as agro-tourism and supply chain industries nationwide.

AirAsia Group chief executive officer Tan Sri Tony Fernandes said the company, which cut its teeth in

away, we can start selling Harumanis all over the Asean region," said Fernandes.

Other fruits that airasia farm would potentially include in the future were pineapples, bananas, pomelos and dragon fruits.

Earlier, Ronald and Fernandes sent off the AirAsia flight along with AirAsia Group executive chairman Datuk Kamarudin Meranun.

The event was part of the 'Harumanis Kembali Lagi' campaign led by the ministry in collaboration with the Agriculture Department and Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority of Perlis to promote the Harumanis mangoes.

The signature mangoes are now available for online order on airasia fresh and airasia food in the peninsula as well as on foodpanda in Sabah.

In 2011, the Perlis government registered 'Harumanis Perlis' with the Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) to protect its local growers.

The geographical indication 'Harumanis Perlis' meant that such mangoes were grown and harvested in Perlis with specific guidelines issued by the authority.

While the law does not prohibit Harumanis from being grown in other states, they are not allowed to market the products under the name 'Harumanis Perlis' as this was reserved for Perlis-grown Harumanis mangoes.

"That's the birth of airasia farm. Since June last year until now we have recorded about RM3mil sales.

"We are working with over 2,000 farmers in Malaysia supplying 300 businesses throughout Malaysia with various products from fruits and vegetables to eggs and anchovies.

"We have an entire ecosystem to promote Harumanis mangoes including our planes, digital assets and physical restaurants," said

Fernandes in a press conference at klia2 yesterday.

He said it took less than 72 hours upon harvest to send out the first shipment of the mangoes from Perlis to Sabah.

He said with the incredible technology of Malaysian inventions such as the SixFresh fruit sticker, the shelf life and freshness of the mangoes could be prolonged to six months.

"Our strength is cross-border and when we can fly, which is months

KUANTAN - Agensi Penguatkuasaan Maritim Malaysia (Maritim) Pahang merampas tujuh set bubu naga yang ditemui di perairan Sungai Ular hasil rondaan di sekitar kawasan itu pada Khamis.

Peralatan menangkap ikan yang dilarang itu ditemui kira-kira jam 10.10 pagi.

Pengarah Maritim Pahang, Laksamana Pertama Maritim Datuk Amran Daud berkata, bubu berukuran 10 meter setiap satu itu dibawa ke Jeti Pusat Tahanan Vesel Maritim Pahang untuk siasatan lanjut.

Menurutnya, kes diserahkan kepada pegawai penyiasat untuk siasatan mengikut Akta Perikanan 1985 kerana menggunakan peralatan menangkap ikan yang tidak dibenarkan.

“Rampasan bubu naga ini merupakan kes pertama di perairan negeri ini,” katanya melalui satu kenyataan pada Jumaat.

Jual benih padi tanpa kebenaran

Kuala Lumpur: Angkara orang dalam? Persoalan itu timbul selepas ada pihak tertentu dikesan menjual benih padi sah tanpa kebenaran.

Ia susulan serbuan sepasukan anggota pegawai penguatkuasa Kawalselia Padi dan Beras Negeri Kedah ke atas premis di Jalan Sanglang, Jitra, semalam.

Ketua Pengarah Pengawalan Padi dan Beras, Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan (Mafi) Azman Mahmood berkata, dalam pemeriksaan itu pihaknya menemui 76 kampil benih padi sah seberat 1,520 kilogram bernilai RM2,432 di premis dipercayai untuk tujuan jualan.

"Kita tidak menolak kemungkinan terdapat pembabitatan orang dalam kerana yang dibenarkan menjual benih adalah Pertubuhan Peladang Kebangsaan (Nafas) melalui Pertubuhan Peladang Kawasan (PPK).

"Ini kesalahan yang serius kerana melanggar Perintah Tetap Ketua Pengarah Pengawalan Padi Dan Beras yang dikeluarkan dibawah Seksyen 4 Akta Kawalan Padi Dan Beras 1994 - Penetapan Kawalan melalui Surat Kebenaran Ketua Pengarah Terhadap Pemasaran Benih Padi," katanya kepada Harian Metro.

Azman berkata, jika disabitkan kesalahan boleh didenda mengikut Seksyen 22(1) Akta Kawalan Padi Dan Beras tidak melebihi RM15,000 atau dua tahun penjara.

Menurutnya, pihaknya akan terus menjalankan pemeriksaan berdasarkan maklumat awam bagi mengekang pemasaran benih melalui pihak ketiga.

"Mereka ini sebenarnya yang menjejaskan proses membekalkan benih kepada petani.

"Sebab itu di sesetengah tempat, ada isu benih tak cukup dan sebagainya.

"Kita akan siasat siapa mereka ini dan akan mengambil tindakan segera.

"Sebelum ini ada isu menjual benih lama kepada petani, itu sudah kita selesaikan. Sekarang timbul pula jual benih padi yang baru, jadi kita tidak akan berkompromi," katanya.

Little farm abundant with potential

Puchong's hydroponic initiative with vertical farming system attracts public interest

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THE Covid-19 pandemic revealed new challenges for the people, and food security among the poor is one of the issues that came to light.

This led to the idea of urban farming in a public park, said Subang Jaya councillor George Yap Kok Weng.

With the help of Subang Jaya City Council (MBSJ), Kebun By Ambol — a vertical farm — nestled in the Taman Wawasan Recreational Park in Persiaran Wawasan, Taman Wawasan in Puchong, Selangor has been yielding fruitful results since November last year.

"During the pandemic, we saw the potential in urban vertical farming using the hydroponic system.

"Here, vegetables are planted in polyvinyl chloride (PVC) cylindrical towers inserted with sea-weed-based nutrients and connected to water sources.

"A few of us, including my assistant Khooi Chu Boon, visited a vertical farm in Sepang. We liked the idea and decided to replicate it.

"The project was proposed to MBSJ and we were given approval to kick-start a pilot project at Taman Wawasan.

"This is the first project where a small portion of a public park is being used for urban farming," said Yap. It is a collaboration between the council and a private company.

Approximately 9.1m x 18m in size, the farm is a fully netted greenhouse space.

The aim of the project is to raise public awareness of vertical gardens using the hydroponic system.

Among the vegetables grown are bok choy, butterhead lettuce, tomatoes and peppermint as well as fruits such as rock melon.

The crops are sold to the public, priced at RM20 per kilogramme.

Excess vegetables are donated to soup kitchens including Dapur Kinrara, a soup kitchen project initiated by Kinrara assemblyman Ng Sze Han's office.

The project is presently based on a profit-sharing model, with 30% channelled to the city council.

MBSJ, *StarMetro* has learned, uses the money to upgrade and maintain Taman Wawasan.

Vegetables at the farm have been harvested thrice and each harvest

cycle produced about one tonne of vegetables.

MBSJ will take over the operations and management of the farm after the 18th cycle of harvest.

Kebun By Ambol consultant Benjamin Haw said the cost of building the entire infrastructure for the farm was RM100,000.

The hydroponic method has been around since the 1930s and it has been proven to be safe for human consumption, said Haw.

"The nutrients added to the plants are safe too.

"This farming method requires only 10% of water compared to the normal soil farming method.

"Some 5,000 vegetable heads can be planted on a 46.4 sq m plot, whereas the same ground space can only grow 500 vegetable heads.

"The vertical garden does not need much space and we can harvest large quantities in a period of one month," he explained.

There are plans for Kebun By Ambol to become an educational hub for children and to host school excursions.

Also in the pipeline is a cafe on site, where vegetables sold can be cooked on the spot based on the garden-to-kitchen concept.

Farm caretakers Chandran Kutty, Manoharan Perumal and Mahendran Karilapan are retired professional landscapers who enjoy spending time at the farm.

They enjoy tending to the vegeta-

bles and are interested in environmentally friendly farming methods that produce less carbon footprint.

"People ask a lot of questions when they come here.

"This is good as they too get to take home knowledge and either implement what they have learned at home or teach others," said Chandran.

Customers can harvest their own vegetables with the caretakers' assistance.

Ng, who is also state local government, public transportation and new village development committee chairman, said the pandemic had focused attention on the importance of food sources.

"Urbanites are encouraged to make full use of vacant land after getting approval from the local council and relevant authorities, and use it for community learning.

"I have seen so many successful community farm projects in Selangor.

"Those interested to start such projects and need advice, can get in touch with their area councillors who will be able to help," said Ng who was impressed by the farm at Taman Wawasan.

The farm is open on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday from 8am to 10.30am.
