SC, agro agencies eye alternative financing for agriculture sector

KUCHING: The Securities Commission Malaysia (SC) and key agriculture agencies have discussed ways to address financing gaps faced by micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) involved in the agriculture sector in a bid to boost the country's food security.

Some 40 representatives from agencies and industry players this week attended a workshop called GROW - a new collaborative programme under SC's fintech flagship initiative, SCxSC.

GROW⁺ is a collaborative effort by the SC and ecosystem partners to harness the potential of alternative fund-raising digital platforms to meet the needs of underserved players in strategic sectors, such as agriculture.

Equity crowdfunding (ECF) and peer-to-peer (P2P) financing were among the alternative financing mechanisms that were addressed during the workshop as potential ways to help fund the sector.

The SC chairman Datuk Seri Dr Awang Adek Hussin stressed the importance of broadening access to the capital market for local businesses.

"We have seen how technology has democratised financing via digital platforms such as ECF and P2P financing," he told the workshop.

"We believe these alternative financing avenues have the potential to address some of the funding needs of the MSMEs in the agriculture sector as well."

Senior officials from relevant ministries, agencies and key players in the agriculture ecosystem attended the one-day workshop.

They included the Ministry of

Agriculture and Food Industry, Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (FAMA) and Agrobank.

At the workshop, participants called for greater ecosystem coordination to move the agriculture sector forward and strengthen the country's food security.

They also emphasised the need for greater awareness on the role of alternative financing for the

agriculture sector.

They welcomed the development of more innovative financing instruments to cater to the diverse agro-business needs.

Following the workshop, the SC plans to have greater industry engagements with key stakeholders next year including organising a GROW⁺ Fintech Conference.

This will be followed by a nationwide GROW⁺ roadshow to raise awareness on ECF and P2P financing as viable funding options for agro-based MSMEs to grow their businesses.

These programmes will complement ongoing efforts by the government to support alternative fundraising by agriculture businesses such as the Malaysia Co-investment Fund (MyCIF).

MyCIF, a public-private co-investment vehicle administered by the SC on behalf of the Ministry of Finance, has observed a greater uptake of ECF campaigns in the agriculture sector after implementing a special ratio of 1:2 in 2022 for this sector.

MyCIF invests RM1 for every RM2 raised from private investors on the participating platforms by eligible issuers.

It has co-invested in a range of agriculture projects in

upstream and downstream activities, including firms applying technology to improve agriculture yields and aquaculture production.

We have seen how technology has democratised financing via digital platforms such as ECF and P2P financing. We believe these alternative financing avenues have the potential to address some of the funding needs of the MSMEs in the agriculture sector as well.

Syarikat M'sia dijangka jana potensi nilai eksport RM6.5 juta

BANGKOK: Misi Lembaga Pemasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (FAMA) di pameran Asia Fruit Logistica 2022 di Bangkok, Thailand dijangka menjana potensi nilai eksport RM6.5 juta.

Tahun ini, bge syarikat peng-eksport telah diketengahkan oleh FAMA, iaitu DRS Trading Sdn Bhd, Makutas Marketing Sdn Bhd dan Aqina Fruits Sdn Bhd.

Syarikat berkenaan menyerta Asia Fruit Logistica, pameran khusus bagi sektor buah-buahan yang terbesar di Asia di Queen Sirikit National Convention Centre di sini yang berlangsung dari 2 hingga 4 November 2022.

Buah-buahan dipromosikan adalah durian sejuk beku, nenas segar, belimbing, tembikai, nenas dan produk hiran berasaskan buah-buahan.

Selain itu, beberapa produk baru turut diperkenalkan pada pameran itu termasuk nenas kering, pati ayam nenas, enok berasaskan nenas dan serbuk durian.

FAMA dalam satu kenyataan berkata, usahawan Malaysia dijangka mencajatkan nilai potensi eksport sebanyak RM6.5 juta menerusi permintaan yang baik dari negara seperti Amerika

Syarikat, United Kingdom, Japan, China, Korea dan negara Timur Tengah antaranya Emirjan Arab Bersatu (UAE) dan Lubnaan.

"Menerusi maklum balas yang diterima, buah-buahan tropikal Malaysia mendapat permintaan yang memberangsangkan dari pengguna global terutamanya buah-buahan segar seperti nenas, durian dan nangka serta produk hiran," katanya.

Duta Besar Malaysia ke Thailand, Datuk Jojie Samuel turut melawat ke gerai-gerai peng-eksport Malaysia di Asia Fruit Logistica kemarin.

Penyertaan FAMA pada Asia Fruit Logistica itu bertujuan membantu memperluas dan mem-pekukuhkan pasaran buah-buahan tropika Malaysia di peringkat global.

Promosi seumpama itu telah dilakukan sejak tahun 2004.

Sementara itu, Kaunselor Pertanian Pejabat Penasihat Pertanian Bangkok, Hairuddin Masjan berharap lebih banyak syarikat Malaysia berkelayakan menyerta pameran antarabangsa seperti Asia Fruit Logistica di Thailand untuk mengembangkan keha-diran pasaran mereka di peringkat global.

Pameran sebegini akan

memberi peluang kepada syarikat-syarikat Malaysia menerokai pasaran baharu dan menembusi pasaran yang lebih besar," kata beliau kepada Bernama.

Beliau berkata, Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan (MAFI) menerusi FAMA secara berterusan menyediakan platform

kepada komuniti perusahan kecil dan sederhana (PKS) tempatan untuk meneroka pasaran eksport di seluruh dunia menerusi jafahan dan agensinya.

Sez pasaran eksport yang terbuka dan luas menawarkan pulangan yang lebih menguntungkan serta sebagai alternatif

kepada pasaran domestik yang terhad.

"Walaupun bidang pengeksport mempunyai cabaran dan risiko yang tinggi, namun usahawan Malaysia perlu diperkayakan dan dibimbing untuk berdaya maju diperingkat global," kata beliau. —Bernama
