Muncul durian kampung premium pertama Jerantut

# Durian emas DAF1 pintas damak king

**JERANTUT** – Durian emas berjaya didaftarkan sebagai durian kampung premium (DKP) pertama di daerah ini dengan nama DAF1, sekali gus mendahului pendaftaran damak king yang turut terkenal di daerah ini.

Keenakan durian yang dinamakan durian yang dibukit di kaki Gunung Benom itu membuatkan ia menjadi tarikan kerana kemanisannya kekal meskipun selepas buah itu habis dimakan selain baunya yang wangi.

Pemilik DAF1, Mohd. Idafi Mohd. Roseli berkata, pada masa ini terdapat kira-kira 15 batang pokok durian DAF1 dengan nombor pendaftaran D231 yang ber-

usia kira-kira 30 tahun.

"Pokok asalnya hidup sendiri di dalam hutan dan apabila orang kampung teroka Kampung Ulu Cheka, memang pokok itu masih hidup, tetapi arwah ayah saya biakkan dengan kaedah kahwin pucuk baji dan ditanam ke kawasan ini.

"Memang sejak dahulu ia menjadi rebutan penggemar durian kerana isi kekuningan serta tebal dengan rasa lemak manis dan pahit-pahit," katanya ketika ditemu bual di sini semalam.

Menurutnya, pada masa ini, setiap pokok durian DAF1 menghasilkan purata 100 hingga 150 biji setiap kali musim dengan berat melebihi dua kilogram sebiji.

Katanya, permintaan yang diterima daripada orang ramai

amat menggalakkan sekali sehingga ia tidak mencukupi bagi menampung permintaan.

Sementara itu, Pegawai Pertanian Daerah Jerantut, Rafeah Rabiatus Othman berkata, DAF1 yang mempunyai 'wow' faktor berjaya didaftarkan pada awal tahun ini, sekali gus menjadi buah durian kampung pertama didaftarkan di daerah ini.

Katanya, buah tersebut telah berjaya dilakukan pencirian termasuk syarat sekurang-kurangnya mempunyai lima pokok yang berbuah dengan ciri sama.

"Pada masa ini, kami sedang giat melakukan pencirian ke atas durian damak king bagi mendaftarkan durian berkenaan sebagai durian kampung premium dalam masa terdekat," ujarnya.

# Spesies ikan bandar raya 'ancam' Negeri Sembilan

**SEREMBAN:** Ancaman ikan asing khususnya ikan *Pleco* atau dikenali sebagai ikan bandar raya turut dihadapi negeri ini apabila Jabatan Perikanan mengesahkan sungai-sungai di sekitar kawasan Mambau, di sini terjejas dengan kehadiran spesies itu.

Ketua Cawangan Sumber Perikanan Tangkapan Jabatan Perikanan Negeri Sembilan, Doreen Wee Siew Leen berkata, Sungai Kampung Kayu Ara, Mambau khususnya terjejas dengan masalah tersebut dan dibuktikan menerusi pemantauan dilakukan bersama Komuniti Pemburu Ikan Bandaraya (KPIB), kelmarin.

Katanya, persampelan yang dibuat menggunakan jala di sungai itu baru-baru ini mendapati, sebanyak 41 ekor ikan bandar raya selain spesies ikan asing lain iaitu seekor ikan lampam Siam dan seekor tilapia hitam diperolehi dengan sekali tebar sahaja.

"Sungai ini diketahui memang sudah banyak ikan bandar raya dan kali ini disahkan lagi hasil pemantauan yang dibuat.

"Buat masa ini Sungai Kampung Kayu Ara paling banyak ikan bandar raya, di sungai-sungai lain kami ada juga menerima aduan tetapi perlu dibuat pengesahan terlebih dahulu," katanya ketika dihubungi *Utusan Malaysia* di sini.

Beliau berkata, sebagai usaha mambanteras kehadiran ikan bandar raya, pihaknya bersama KPIB mengadakan Program Inventori Perikanan dan Buru Ikan Asing di Kampung Kayu Ara, bulan depan.

"Ia bukan hanya memburu ikan bandar raya tetapi ikan asing lain. Selepas itu pihak kami akan memantau di sungai-sungai lain berdasarkan aduan yang diterima," katanya.

Ikan bandar raya adalah spesies invasif yang mana tabiat pemakanan, pembiakan dan perkembangannya mengganggu habitat ikan asli di perairan tempatan.

## Penyeludup lembu, kerbau cabut lari tinggalkan Mykad

**TANAH MERAH** - Dua lelaki yang sedang menyeludup lembu dan kerbau lari lintang-pulang dengan meninggalkan MyKad selepas menyedari kegiatan haram mereka dikesan anggota tentera di tebing Sungai Golok di sini kelmarin.

Dua lelaki itu menyeludup sembilan haiwan ternakan tersebut di kawasan paman-tauan Briged Kelapan Infantri Malaysia berdekatan sempadan Malaysia-Thailand pada pukul 6.15 petang.

Markas Divisyen Kedua Infantri Malaysia (Dua Divisyen) berkata, ketika kejadian, mereka berdua sempat melarikan diri dengan menyeberangi Sungai Golok ke negara jiran dengan meninggalkan kerbau dan lembu bernilai RM 78,705.

"Pemeriksaan di lokasi tersebut mendapati penye-

ludup meninggalkan motosikal dan barangan peribadi termasuk kad pengenalan (MyKad)," katanya dalam satu kenyataan semalam.

Menurut kenyataan itu, pihak tentera kemudian membuat laporan di Balai Polis Lalang Pepuyu dan kesemua haiwan tersebut diserahkan kepada Jabatan Perkhidmatan Kuarantin dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia (Maqis).

Kes disiasat oleh Jabatan Kastam Diraja Malaysia, Kompleks Imigresen, Kastam, Kuarantin dan Keselamatan (ICQS) Bukit Bunga.

Mengikut rekod, terdapat tiga kes rampasan melibatkan haiwan ternakan oleh tentera sepanjang tahun ini melibatkan 69 ekor lembu pada 16 Jun, 17 ekor lembu (19 Ogos) dan yang terbaharu kelmarin.

# Tiada air: Tiga musim tidak tanam padi, pesawah hilang punca rezeki

**KOTA BHARU:** Petani di Kampung But, Ketebeh di sini mendakwa terpaksa menggunakan wang tabungan untuk meneruskan kelangsungan hidup selepas tidak dapat mengusahakan tanaman padi ekoran masalah bekalan air.

Dakwa mereka, keadaan itu menyebabkan mereka mengalami kerugian teruk dalam tempoh tiga musim berturut-turut kerana kehilangan sumber pendapatan.

Seorang pesawah, Aswari Nawi, 39, berkata, ketika ini dia bergantung sepenuhnya kepada wang tabungan setelah tiga musim kehilangan sumber pendapatan akibat masalah ketiadaan air.

Menurutnya, bagi mengelak keadaan menjadi lebih parah dia terpaksa berjimat cermat bagi memastikan kewangannya diurus dengan baik.

“Keadaan ini sangat terkesan buat kami sebagai pesawah kerana ini adalah satu-satunya mata pencarian kami,” katanya.

Tinjauan Utusan Malaysia rata-rata pesawah mengeluh dan

tersepit sama ada mahu atau tidak mengambil risiko mengusahakan sawah padi susulan perit dengan ketiadaan sumber bekalan air ketika ini.

Dakwa mereka, masalah itu akan berterusan selagi Lembaga Kemajuan Pertanian Kemubu (KADA) tidak mampu menyelesaikan masalah bekalan air.

Sementara itu, seorang lagi petani Tamlikhan Mohd. Resdi, 39, memberitahu, sudah tiga musim berturut-turut dia tidak dapat mengusahakan tanaman padi akibat masalah tersebut.

Katanya, situasi itu menyebabkan dia dan rakan-rakan petani lain sudah kehabisan modal pusingan untuk menanam padi.

“Besarnya harapan saya agar masalah air ini segera diselesaikan, jika tidak kami akan terus berdepan dengan kerugian sekali gus boleh menjejaskan sumber makanan negara.

“Sekiranya kami ambil keputusan untuk meneruskan kerja tanam padi musim ini, berkemungkinan besar lebih banyak kerugian terpaksa ditanggung kerana musim tengkujuh semakin menghampiri,” ujarnya.

## e-Tani jadi ejen perubahan pembangunan pertanian Sarawak



KOTA SAMARAHAN, 5 Sept: Platform e-Tani di bawah Jabatan Pertanian Sarawak bakal menjadi ejen perubahan bagi pembangunan pertanian negeri, kata Menteri Industri Makanan, Komoditi dan Pembangunan Wilayah Sarawak Dato Sri Dr Stephen Rundi Utom.

Beliau berkata e-Tani ialah sistem dalam talian komprehensif yang direka untuk merevolusikan cara petani menerima bantuan dan mengurus sumber mereka, di samping menjadi sistem dalam talian yang membolehkan petani mendaftar dan membuat profil.

“Platform ini membantu menjejaki aktiviti mereka, mengenal pasti perniagaan utama mereka, dan memahami keperluan khusus mereka,” katanya kepada pemberita selepas lawatan kerja ke bangunan baharu Pertubuhan Peladang Sarawak (PPNS) di sini, hari ini.

Dr Rundi berkata melalui platform itu, kerajaan boleh menyediakan petani dengan peruntukan sumber yang cekap berdasarkan keperluan mereka.

“Dengan menjejaki jenis pertanian dan keperluan khusus setiap petani melalui profil e-Tani mereka, sistem ini boleh memperuntukkan sumber dan bantuan dengan lebih cekap.

“Ini membantu mengelakkan situasi yang menyebabkan bekalan seperti baja diberikan kepada mereka yang tidak memerlukannya, sekali gus meminimumkan pembaziran,” katanya.

Beliau berkata platform itu menyediakan maklumat tentang tempat untuk mencari produk berkualiti terbaik dan cara mendapatkan barangan terbaik, membantu petani memahami pengkhususan produk serantau.

Sementara itu, PPNS dalam kenyataan berkata bangunan baharunya yang terletak di sini akan dibuka secara rasmi oleh Premier Sarawak Tan Sri Abang Johari Tun Openg pada 22 Sept.

Bangunan yang dibina dengan kos kira-kira RM20 juta itu terdiri daripada pejabat utama, bilik mesyuarat, e-Kedai Peladang, dewan majlis, galeri jualan, pusat perniagaan, halaman pembenihan, Kiosk Input Agri, pasar tani dan kemudahan lain.

Pembangunan di bawah Fasa Dua dijangka bermula tahun depan yang akan merangkumi gudang untuk input dan pengangkutan pertanian, bilik sejuk untuk produk pertanian,

kawasan kemudahan eksport untuk pelepasan kastam, dan kawasan lapang untuk dataran perayaan. – TVS

KOTA SAMARAHAN (Sept 5): The newly built Sarawak State Farmers Organisation (PPNS) complex is anticipated to be a game changer for local farmers, offering improved facilities to help them tap into more profitable markets, said Dato Sri Dr Stephen Rundi Utom.

According to the Minister of Food Industries, Commodities and Regional Development (M-Ficord), the new facilities will equip farmers with the necessary guidance on sales management and help them expand their market reach.

He said Sarawak has over 9,600 products and more farmers are encouraged to market their products through the platforms given by PPNS.

### Dr Rundi: New farmers organisation complex in Kota Samarahan expected to be game changer

"PPNS cannot reject any farmer. We have to look at the potential of each farmer and advise them which products have the best marketability.

"Sometimes, some of these products require consistent supply as some of them are seasonal or available year-round.

"Durian and other fruits are seasonal, but once we have these seasonal fruits, we must go downstream and process them so the sale will be continued," said Dr Rundi during a media briefing after his work visit to the new PPNS complex here today.

Speaking on the new PPNS complex, Dr Rundi said it will function as a one-stop centre for agricultural retail and downstream activities.

He emphasised that the ministry's objective is to provide those in Sarawak's agricultural sector with access to a comprehensive supply chain, covering everything from production to retail.

Covering around 5.84 acres, the facility is scheduled to be officially inaugurated by Premier Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Abang Johari Tun Openg on Sept 25.

PPNS also plans to build a warehouse for agricultural input and transportation, cold rooms for farmers' products, and an export facility area for customs clearance.

Among the new building's facilities are Peladang e-Shop, a hall, a business centre, a seedling courtyard, agri-input kiosks, a farmers market, a sales gallery, a cafeteria and a prayer room.

By 2025, the centre will also feature an open space for festivals and events.

Meanwhile, Dr Rundi also revealed that 22 vendors from Sarawak will participate in the Malaysian Agriculture, Horticulture and Agro Tourism (Maha) 2024 exhibition.

M-Ficord deputy permanent-secretary Sayed Ismail Nasiruddin Wan Hashim said the signature products that will be brought to the exhibition would be gula apong, tilapia and terubok, kolon mee and laksa.


# From ploughs to **propellers**

UPON graduating from Universiti Islam Selangor in 2019, Shaimi Farhan Ridwanwan Shahmi, who hails from the peaceful region of north Selangor, was looking for a job in between interviews.

He helped at a friend's burger cafe for part-time jobs at nearby shops to eat, gas and clear ditches.

Like for the business degree offered the chance to become a drone operator with Supersal Drone Services, a company in Sungai Besar (NSR731).

The government cooperative was formed under the agricultural transformation programme in 2012.

**Drone training, business**

Shaimi said he learned to fly drones for plant nourishment, soil treatment or pest control. He was trained by the company's staff at the Sungai Kemuning Agricultural Department.

Participants with the Mohamud scores were given prizes," he said.

With a RM12,000 loan from his mother, he bought his own drone and offered his service to farmers.

Now 31, he makes close to RM5,000 a month providing services to farmers in Sungai Kemuning, Selangor.

# Demand soars for drone operators

## Service helps Selangor padi farmers, plantation workers to complete big tasks faster

The drone will be operated manually so that pesticide don't end up on roads, which will be a big problem.

"Automatic mode is used over open fields, thorny fields and on roads, but it's still by manual events," he said.

The wind factor is also crucial in this. This includes knowing the wind's direction at all times to prevent the drone from colliding with tall trees or cables.

"It is also to ensure the drone's spray had dies not end up in the worst case scenario, misjudging the wind direction and the pesticide being blown into your face," said Shaimi.

**Looking to the skies**

Mohd Moksem Bani, 61, and Shaimi, 31, are the founders of SUPERSAL, chairman, recalled when drone first made an appearance in Selangor in 2013, a year after the formation of the cooperative.

"I was using the traditional sack sprayer to apply pesticide and fertilizer, they could not reach the top of the trees, except that the task could be done by hand," he said.

"They changed their minds and started using drones (only 120 days) when they saw the results," he said.
