Fishermen to benefit from grassroots-level shipyards

ALOR SETAR: Infrastructure such as shipyards at the Area Fishermen's Association (PNK) level is an important socio-economic project in generating income and improving the social development of local fishermen, says Datuk Seri Mohamad Sabu.

The Agriculture and Food Security Minister said while Malaysia is widely recognised for its large-scale shipyards, grassroots-level facilities form part of the government's strategy to strengthen local supply chains, develop talent and modernise the fisheries industry.

"This shipyard is a clear example of how PNK can play an active role in the Shipbuilding and Ship Repair (SBSR) industry value chain by providing up-slip, down-slip, repair and maintenance services for fishing vessels," he said at the opening of the Kuala Kedah PNK Shipyard here yesterday, Bernama reported.

The project, developed at a cost of RM10.7mil, was completed over four years.

Mohamad said every repair and maintenance activity carried out at the shipyard contributes directly to the national food security agenda.

"A vessel that is repaired quickly and is safe to operate enables fishermen to return to sea sooner, helping to ensure a continuous supply of seafood to markets and households," he added.

Mohamad said as of October, total fish landings nationwide stood at 115,000 metric tonnes, valued at RM473mil.

"Kuala Kedah recorded fish landings of 1,038 metric tonnes worth RM6.231mil.

"The ministry is confident that the PNK here can further improve its contribution to the national fisheries industry," he added.

Mohamad also said the ministry would continue to support technical training programmes in collaboration with PNK shipyards and encourage young fishermen to seize opportunities to participate in related courses.

Putrajaya: Jabatan Pertanian (DOA) melaksanakan langkah strategik memendekkan tempoh kelulusan pengimportan bijirin daripada dua bulan kepada sebulan sebagai usaha proaktif memperkukuh keterjaminan makanan negara serta memastikan kelangsungan operasi industri makanan.

Ketua Pengarah Pertanian Datuk Nor Sam Alwi berkata, keputusan itu susulan keperluan industri yang bergantung kepada bekalan bijirin import sebagai bahan mentah utama, khususnya sektor makanan ternakan yang menjadi tulang belakang bekalan protein negara.

"Keputusan dibuat untuk memenuhi keperluan kritikal sektor pemprosesan makanan manusia serta industri makanan ternakan dalam memastikan bekalan mencukupi, stabil dan berterusan bagi menyokong operasi industri serta menggalakkan pertumbuhan sektor pertanian dan pemprosesan makanan," katanya.

Nor Sam berkata, pemendekkan tempoh kelulusan itu juga digerakkan

melalui penambahan menyeluruh tatakelola pengimportan konsainan berasaskan tumbuhan dengan memanfaatkan digitalisasi sepenuhnya.

Penggunaan sistem digitalisasi secara menyeluruh membolehkan seluruh proses permohonan pengimportan sehingga pengeluaran Permit Import (IP) dipercepat tanpa menjejaskan kawal selia dan keselamatan biosekuriti negara.

Ditanya perbezaan proses baharu dengan kaedah lama, beliau berkata, sebelum ini proses itu memerlukan semakan berpe-

ringkat dan memabatkan masa pemprosesan lebih panjang.

"Proses baharu menekankan digitalisasi dan integrasi sistem *end-to-end* yang membolehkan semakan, rujukan dan kelulusan dilakukan lebih cepat, telus dan seragam. Proses pepadanan maklumat negara sumber, syarat fitosanitasi dan kelulusan permit kini lebih efisien melalui platform digital bersepadu," katanya.

Antara teknologi utama menyokong inisiatif itu ialah *Sistem Malaysia Import Control System* (MyALCS) oleh DOA yang ber-

fungsi sebagai rujukan fitosanitasi nasional dan Sistem AgroTrade oleh Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan (KPKM) bagi kelulusan negara sumber baharu dalam tempoh lima hari bekerja.

Turut digunakan Sistem ePermit oleh Jabatan Perkhidmatan Kuarantin dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia (MAQIS) bagi pengeluaran IP dengan kelulusan permit diproses lebih cepat dan teratur kerana tiga sistem itu beroperasi secara bersepadu yang menyumbang kepada kecekapan keseluruhan rantaian proses.

Nor Sam berkata, pemendekkan tempoh kelulusan pengimportan bijirin memberi impak positif yang signifikan kepada pengimport, industri ternakan dan pasaran tempatan, khususnya dalam memastikan kelancaran rantaian bekalan bahan mentah berasaskan tumbuhan.

"Langkah ini memudahkan pengimport terutama pengusaha industri makanan ternakan mendapatkan bekalan bijirin dengan lebih cepat dan teratur serta mengurangkan risiko kelewatan bekalan yang boleh menjejaskan operasi pemprosesan.

"Ia juga memastikan setiap konsainan bijirin diimport mematuhi peraturan fitosanitasi ditetapkan serta bebas daripada ancaman perosak selaras keperluan kawal selia dan keselamatan biosekuriti negara selain menyokong kelancaran rantaian bekalan makanan ternakan dan kestabilan pasaran domestik," katanya.

Sebelum ini, DOA mengkaji semula syarat pengimportan bijirin eko-terdapat ketidakpatuhan syarat import seperti pintasan perosak (perosak produk simpanan) dan terdapat artikel terkawal (sekam, tangkai, kulit dan lain-lain) dalam konsainan.

Kes 2 haiwan mati di klinik disiasat

SHAH ALAM – Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar Selangor (DVS Selangor) menjalankan siasatan lanjut berhubung dakwaan pengabaian dua haiwan sehingga mati di sebuah klinik haiwan swasta sekitar Damansara Damai di Petaling Jaya dekat sini.

DVS Selangor berkata, pihaknya mengesahkan telah menerima aduan secara rasmi selepas video berkaitan yang tular di beberapa rangkaian media sosial.

Menurutnya, sepasukan Pegawai Kebajikan Haiwan (PKH) DVS Selangor telah menjalankan pemeriksaan di lokasi kejadian kira-kira pukul 12.30 tengah hari, semalam.

“Hasil pemeriksian mendapati terdapat masing-masing seekor karkas anjing dan kucing diletakkan di dua buah sangkar haiwan yang berasingan di seki-

tar lokasi kejadian.

“Berdasarkan pemeriksaan awal mendapati haiwan itu dianggarkan telah mati antara satu atau dua minggu yang lalu,” katanya dalam kenyataan semalam.

DVS menambah, PKH telah mengambil kedua-dua karkas haiwan dan dua buah sangkar haiwan tersebut untuk pemeriksaan dan siasatan selanjutnya.

Jelasnya, kes disiasat di bawah subseksyen 29(1)(e) Akta Kebajikan Haiwan 2015 [Akta 772].

“Mana-mana saksi bagi kes ini diminta untuk tampil ke pejabat DVS bagi membantu siasatan kes itu.

“Sasatan rapi dan telus akan dijalankan tanpa sebarang kompromi atau pilih kasih,” katanya.

Tambah baik sistem saliran atasi sawah tenggelam

KANGAR: Perubahan corak iklim dan monsun tidak menentu mengundang kesukaran kepada pesawah khususnya di utara tanah air apabila hujan ekstrem menyebabkan setiap tahun sawah padi tenggelam.

Banjir besar melanda Perlis dan Kedah baru-baru ini menimbulkan kebimbangan serius terhadap keterjaminan makanan negara apabila bencana itu menenggelamkan seluas 14,785.56 hektar sawah dan menjejaskan 9,286 pesawah serta anggaran kerugian mencecah RM41 juta.

Sebahagian besar tanaman yang terjejas berusia kira-kira sebulan, sekali gus menjejaskan penanaman semula dan menimbulkan kebimbangan ramai pesawah untuk meneruskan musim ini.

Pensyarah Kanan Fakulti Perniagaan dan Komunikasi, Universiti Malaysia Perlis (Unimap), Dr. Atikah Nor Johari berkata, meskipun kerajaan memulih dan menaik taraf sebahagian infrastruktur pengairan serta tebatan banjir, kerosakan besar akibat banjir 2024 dan 2025 jelas menunjukkan pelaksanaan belum mencukupi.

Katanya, kerajaan perlu meng-

amalkan pendekatan proaktif, sistematik dan menyeluruh bukan sekadar reaktif untuk melindungi sawah padi daripada risiko banjir dan perubahan iklim jangka panjang.

“Kerajaan perlu mengenal pasti terlebih dahulu semua kawasan sawah termasuk di luar kawasan Lembaga Kemajuan Pertanian Muda (MADA) yang mempunyai sistem saliran dan

pengairan rosak atau usang.

“Kawasan berkenaan perlu diklasifikasikan mengikut tahap risiko supaya projek naik taraf, seperti pembinaan kolam tadahan, parit pemisah, empangan kecil, pam berkapasiti tinggi dan sistem kawalan air, dapat diberi keutamaan,” katanya di sini semalam.

Katanya, penyelenggaraan berkala amat penting bukan

sekali guna termasuk pembersihan saluran, pemeriksaan pam dan sistem pintu air.

“Selepas projek dilaksanakan, penilaian dan audit harus dijalankan bagi memastikan sawah kembali produktif dan risiko banjir berkurangan,” katanya.

Beliau mencadangkan integrasi sistem pengurusan air dengan amaran dan pemantauan termasuk penggunaan sistem maklumat geografi (GIS), sensor paras air dan sistem amaran awal bagi membolehkan pesawah bersedia hadapi banjir.

Dalam pada itu, seorang pesawah, Shahidan Bahrom, 63, berkata, banjir baru-baru ini menyaksikan tanaman padi yang diusahakan di kawasan seluas kira-kira 24.174 hektar musnah.

“Daripada keseluruhan keluasan tanaman itu, hanya sekitar 4.266 hektar sahaja mungkin boleh diusahakan kembali namun hasilnya masih belum dapat dipastikan lagi.

“Saya telah mengeluarkan modal lebih RM10,000 bagi mengusahakan padi musim ini dan kebanyakan tanaman musnah ekoran banjir tersebut. Setiap kali hujan lebat, pesawah juga sentiasa berdepan kebimbangan risiko sawah tenggelam,” katanya.
